Short title.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the

PUBLIC SAFETY (MEETINGS AND GATHERINGS)
REGULATIONS.

Prohibited area.

2. No meeting or gathering of three or more persons shall be held on that piece of land in Belize City commonly known as Harley's open lot being the piece of land lying between Regent Street and Albert Street, and between the unnamed road being an extension of Bishop Street running in front of the Cattouse building and the former office of W. H. Courtenay and Company at No.9 Regent Street without the permission of the Commissioner of Police.

Penalty..

3. Every person who infringes or contravenes the provisions of Regulation 2 of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five hundred dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months or to both such fine and imprisonment.
