**Regulations on Informational Institutions Regarding Regulated
Professions**

Issued in accordance with Article 3, point 2, and Article
56, Part IV of the Law on Regulated Professions and
Recognition of Professional Qualifications

1. Regulations state the Informational Institutions as regards regulated professions, except those regulated professions requiring higher education either in Latvia or abroad.
2. The following Informational Institutions have been indicated:
 - 2.1. Non-profit organization State Stock Company “Road Traffic Safety Directorate” for the following regulated professions of a driver of motor vehicles (except tractor-type vehicles), driver of motor vehicles with dangerous freight, instructor of drivers for theoretical subject training, instructor of drivers for practical training, instructor of drivers of motor vehicles with dangerous freight, inspector of transport technical control;
 - 2.2. State Technical Supervision Inspection for the regulated profession of the driver of tractor-type motor vehicles.
 - 2.3. Non-profit organization State Company of Limited Liability “ Road Transport Directorate” for the regulated professions of -international road haulage operator (administrator), international road passenger

- transport operator (administrator), inland road haulage operator (administrator), inland road haulage operator (administrator), inland road passenger transport operator (administrator);
- 2.4. Ministry of Transport for the regulated professions of – safety consultant (advisor) for carriage of dangerous freight, instructor of safety consultants (advisors) for carriage of dangerous freight;
- 2.5. Non-profit organization State Stock Company “Maritime Administration of Latvia”, the Seamen’s Register of Latvia for the regulated professions in seafaring;
- 2.6. Civil Aviation Administration for the regulated professions in Civil Aviation as well as regarding Airport professions;
- 2.7. Ministry of Agriculture for the regulated professions in field of animal husbandry.
3. Regarding other regulated professions, not mentioned in the above regulations, the information is provided by the Academic Information Centre.
4. The Regulations come into force on 1 January 2003.
