LAW NO. 8 OF 1989 on the Right of Women to Assume Posts in the Judiciary

THE GENERAL PEOPLE’S CONGRESS;

Having examined the Declaration on the Establishment of the authority of the People;

The Great “Green Charter on Human Rights in the Era of the Jamahiriya”;

Law No 9, on the Organization of People’s Congresses and International meetings;

Law No 51 of 1976 on the Organization of the Judiciary,

The decisions of the Basic People’s Congress at its 2nd. Ordinary Session of 1988, as drafted by the General Conference of the Peoples’ Congresses, the People’s Committees, and General People’s Congress at its 15th. Ordinary Session from 25 Rajab, 1398 to 2nd. Shaaban, 30, June 9 to 7/7/1989,

Has drafted the following Legislation:

ARTICLE 1

A woman may assume judicial posts, as well as the posts with the Public Prosecution and administration of Justice under the same terms as for men.

ARTICLE 2

Any decision to the is null and void.

ARTICLE 3

This Law shall enter into force as of promulgation. It shall be published in the Official Gazette.

The Minister for Labour & Social Affairs shall implement this Law and apply it as of date of publication in the Official Gazette.
