Beyond Borders: Governance of Work in a Global Economy



15th Ilera World Congress, Philadelphia, USA, 2-5 July 2012

Congress News

Under the general theme "Beyond borders: Governance of Work in a Global Economy", the congress will deal with the following subjects: Trans-national Movement of Labour & Growing Diversity in the Workforce: Labour and Social Movements Responding to Globalization: Emerging Orders of Production and Skill Development in a Global Economy: Raising the Floor for Rights at Work in a Globalizing Economy: and Income and Employment through the Life Course.

More than 300 papers were received on these themes from individuals in 45 countries. Of these, 242 have been accepted for presentation, with the best papers selected for the main programme and the others in the poster/communications sessions. All papers will be included in the Congress Proceedings. In addition, 28 proposals for special sessions, involving over 140 presenters, were received, of which 17 were accepted.

REPORTS AND PROCEEDINGS

In 2011, ILERA, with financial assistance from the ILO, organized two seminars. The first one was in Cape Town, South Africa, on public sector labour relations. The purpose of this seminar was to evaluate the impact of the global financial crisis on public sector labour relations and explore the interventions required to address existing challenges. The intention was to kick-start a high level discussion on the current state of social dialogue and labour relations in the public sector. The seminar was organized by ILERA's Future President Evance Kalula and took place at the University of Cape Town on 27 and 28 June 2011.

Luis Aparicio Valdez was ILERA's President during 2003-2006 and in this role was the host of the 14th World Congress in Lima in 2006. Sadly, he became quite ill in 2006 as he battled a series of ailments including cancer. Despite this, Luis Aparicio led a team of dedicated colleagues who staged a very successful Congress. He passed away shortly after the Americas Congress held in Buenos Aires in September 2008. Luis Aparicio was known throughout Latin America as a scholar passionately committed to the study of all aspects of labour and industrial relations. He was a prolific author of books and articles. He was committed to the teaching of industrial relations at the university level. In particular, he is remembered for the strong encouragement he gave to many young academic scholars in the field. Shaping Global Industrial Relations: The impact of international framework agreements

Kostas Papadakis, September 2011

This book assesses the phenomenon of IFAs, examining their impact around the world as well as their effectiveness in fostering labour-management dialogue. The book brings together the contributions of 15 specialists, both academics and practitioners, covering the 80-plus IFAs that existed in July 2010. Particular attention is paid to the negotiation and implementation of IFAs, and a number of case studies illuminate the managerial motivation behind the adoption of these agreements. The authors evaluate the consequences of IFAs and assess their potential as a model for cross-border industrial relations in the future. Co-published with Palgrave Macmillan.

Regulating for Decent Work. New directions in labour market regulation

Sangheon Lee and Deirdre McCann



This book is an international and interdisciplinary response to the neoliberal ideologies that have shaped labour market regulation in recent decades. It draws on contributions by leading experts across a range of disciplines, including economics, law, political science and industrial relations. International in scope, it includes chapters on both advanced economies (Canada, Europe, United States) and the developing world (Brazil, China, Indonesia, Tanzania). The volume advances the academic and policy debates on post-crisis labour regulation by identifying new challenges, subjects and theoretical perspectives. In contrast to the dominant deregulatory approaches, it calls for labour market regulation to be reinvigorated.

ILERA. The first recipient of the Luis Aparicio Prize will receive USD 1000 and a plaque. This will be presented at the 16th ILERA World Congress in Philadelphia in July 2012.

ELIGIBILITY

The Prize will be awarded to an emerging scholar based on his/her contributions to the study and research in any aspect of work, employment and employment relations. This Prize is designed to recognize outstanding academic contributions to research by recent entrants to the field. An emerging scholar is a person ten years or less from receipt of the terminal degree (Ph.D. or other terminal degree such as a law degree).

NOMINATIONS

Any member of ILERA, or a member of any of the national associations affiliated with ILERA may nominate a person for this Prize. Letters of nomination should be accompanied by the nominee's resume/vita or by a substantial account of the accomplishments of the nominee.


