Combating and preventing HIV/AIDS-induced child labour in Sub-Saharan Africa: pilot actions in Uganda and Zambia

This *report* is based on study findings on the linkages between HIV/AIDS and child labour in six pilot districts (Lusaka, Luanshya, Livingstone, Kapiri Mposhi, Katete and Chipata) of Zambia under the IPEC HIV/AIDS induced child labour project.

The report brings out the conceptual web of linkages between HIV/AIDS and child labour problems, and the causes and driving factors for children to work. It also makes use of the sectoral analysis to highlight the different forms of work and sectors where child labour is prevalent in the six pilot districts of Zambia. It analyses the key roles and priority activities being undertaken by various stakeholders and players to address the HIV/AIDS and child labour issues. This analysis provides a basis for sector-wide recommendations and approaches that may be applied in tackling HIV/AIDS induced child labour by the various organizations working to combat child labour, as well as those whose main objective is preventing, controlling or eradicating HIV/AIDS.

The report is intended to support different actors within the public and private sectors to plan and implement HIV/AIDS and child labour interventions.

ILO IPEC seeks to increase the knowledge base on child labour and HIV/AIDS issues in order to contribute to effective planning and implementation of appropriate and effective interventions.
