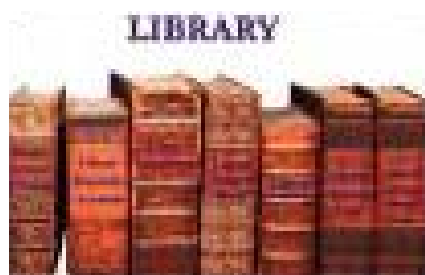

ABSTRACT

The issue of child domestic workers is only indirectly mentioned in the specific exploitations contained within ILO Convention No. 182 on the Worst Forms of Child Labour. It has been left to individual governments to classify as one of the worst forms of labour. But the situation of children working in families other than their own has become an issue of serious concerns within the ILO and its international programme on the elimination of child labour (IPEC). This Asia Meeting was ILO's first tripartite platform in the region to address the gross violations that many children involved in domestic labour experience.

ABSTRACT
