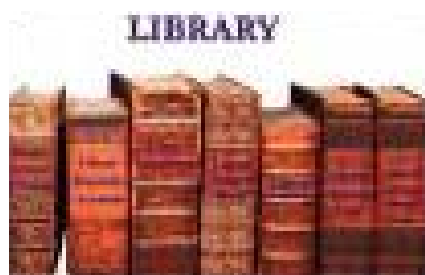

**ABSTRACT**

The rise in disability benefit caseloads, and the resulting increase in programme costs, has become a major concern for policy makers in many advanced welfare states. Many welfare states have introduced reforms that aimed to reduce the number of disability benefit recipients or at least to cut the rate of growth in the caseload, but to date the success of these initiatives has been relatively modest. Rates of growth have declined in some countries, but caseloads remain high.

ABSTRACT

This study revisits poverty and inequality in East Asia and the Pacific, guided by two fundamental concerns. First, poverty remains a problem in the region (Cambodia, China, Korea, Indonesia, Lao PDR, Mongolia, Philippines, Thailand and Viet Nam. Second concerns about inequality are growing in the region. In some case this concern stems from rising inequality, notably in China, Hong Kong, Taiwan and Thailand.

Inequality has also become a concern in Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines and Viet Nam, where evidence of increases in income inequality is less firm.

ABSTRACT

*Pa-aling* is the local name given to a fishing technology said to replace the once controversial labour intensive but highly profitable commercial fishing venture, the *muro-ami*.

Serious and major considerations included undesirable *muro-ami* externalities such as environmental damage and the exploitation of child labour. *Pa-aling*, as a fishing technology, is considered to be safer and environment-friendly since it uses air bubbles from a compressor to drive fishes out from the coral reefs as opposed to *muro-ami* described as "using stones tied on the ends of scarelines which when raised and lowered by swimmers often struck and damaged coral reef, making sounds to scare fish into the net". Fisheries Administrative Order (FAO) 163 through the Department of Agriculture (DA) and its Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) placed a complete ban on *muro-ami* in December 1989.

**ABSTRACT**

This study is in the context of a regional research project of Asian Research Centre for Migration of the Institute of Asian Studies in Thailand, Bangkok on the study of the Thai migrant workers in Southeast and East Asia specifically on the case of Hong Kong.
