# What progress have we made to eliminate the worst forms of child labour by 2016? Find out:

## New ILO Global Child Labour Report and launch of CLIC-AFRICA 19 September 2013

<u>ADDIS ABABA</u> – The latest report on child labour estimates globally and by region will be launched on 23 September by the International Labour Organization (ILO) alongside the creation of the new web page for the Integrated Regional Child Labour Resource Centre: CLIC-Africa.

The report, entitled "Marking progress against child labour: Global estimates and trends 2000-2012", provides the most recent and wide-ranging assessment currently available on the extent of child labour and international efforts to stop it.

The current report is the fourth round of child labour estimates. The analysis takes into consideration the target set by the ILO of eliminating all the worst forms of child labour by 2016.

In Africa, the ILO has recently established a virtual Integrated Regional Child Labour Resource Centre (CLIC-Africa) to support the development of countries' national capacity, ownership and commitment on child labour issues by serving as an information hub on child labour issues.
