

Labour Market- Responsive Technical Vocational Skills Training Programme for the Disadvantaged Youth

The labour market-responsive technical vocational skills training programme aims to increase access to decent work of young women and men. It considers technical vocational education and skills of the disadvantaged youth and the local industry needs. Training graduates are also provided with post-training support and employment services in collaboration with private and public organizations.

BENEFITS

- Increase access to employment opportunities
- Ensure greater impact of training through on-the-job training, gender-sensitivity training, post-training support and employment services
- Develop a competent pool of local skills required by employers and industries
- Provide alternative to youth migration



PROCESS

The technical vocational skills training programme starts with the assessment of the local industry requirements, and the technical vocational skills and training needs of the disadvantaged youth. Career profiling of the disadvantaged youth is done to determine their occupational interest and aptitude. Their training consists of modules on gender-sensitivity, skills training and on-the-job training in partnership with employers. Competency assessment is done to ascertain that competencies acquired by trainees conform to industry standards at the national and international levels. Training graduates are linked with employers to access employment. They are tracked to determine their employment status.
