

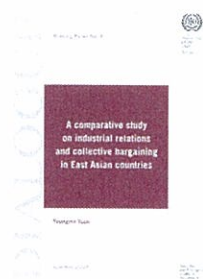

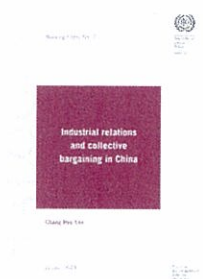

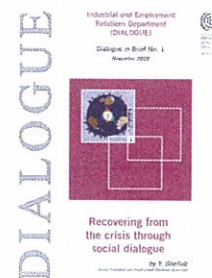
Recovering from the crisis through social dialogue

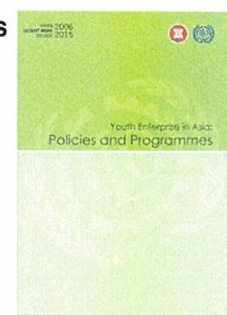

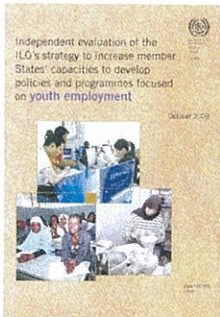

Independent evaluation of the ILO's strategy to increase member States' capacities to develop policies and programmes focused on youth employment

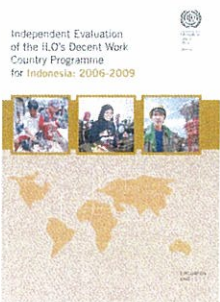
The evaluation addresses the relevance, responsive, added value, coherence, effectiveness and efficiency of ILO support, as well as

Independent evaluation of the ILO's decent work country programme for Indonesia: 2006-2009

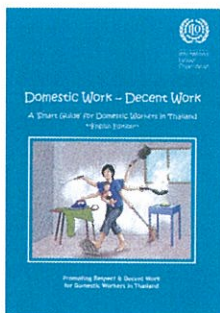
The report presents analyses, findings and recommendations of the independent evaluation of the ILO's decent work country programme (DWCP) in Indonesia, conducted in early 2009.

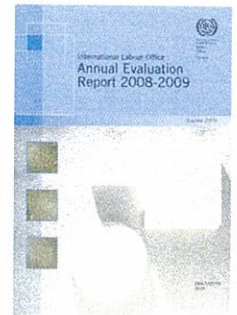

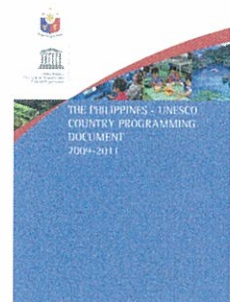
**State of world population 2009.

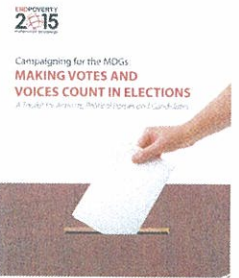

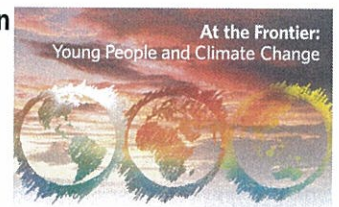


This short guidebook describes how and why the millennium development goals (MDGs) can be important to this process – towards the larger end of achieving human development and better, more equitable world.
