
The Committee of Experts on the Application of Conventions and

General survey concerning employment instruments in light of the 2008 Declaration on Social Justice for a Fair Globalization: Report III (Part 1B). International Labour Conference, 99th Session 2010

The General Survey is composed of three parts. In Part A, the Committee

sets out the historical background to the adoption of the instruments and their links with other international instruments.

In Part B, using the key elements of employment policy that are set out in the legal analysis in Part A, the Committee presents and analyzes the economic and employment data available based on the instruments covered by the General Survey.

Part C reviews the continuing relevance of the employment instruments discussed above. The Committee examines the responses of member States to the questionnaire, which requested those countries not having ratified the Conventions under review to describe the obstacles.

Conceived as an educational tool, this comparative overview aims to contribute to the overall development of a sound labour administration system including industrial relations.



Migration, development and policy reforms


The publication takes a fresh look at the ever-expanding Overseas Filipino Workers (OFW) phenomenon and its role in the development process. It contains overview article on






Human development report, 2009: overcoming barriers-human mobility and development
