

### **Working conditions laws report 2010: a global review**



## DECENT WORK



### **The decent work decade in the Americas, 2006-15: agenda for the hemisphere: initial assessment and perspectives. Report of the Director-General**

The Report of the Director-General to the 16<sup>th</sup> American Regional Meeting in Brasilia of May 2006, set out a proposal for an agenda for the hemisphere for 2006-15 containing objectives for the implementation of ILO action consistent with the Director-General's Report to the 87<sup>th</sup> Session of the International Labour Conference. It provided guidelines enabling the ILO's constituents to draw up social and labour policies based on the concept of decent work through national decent work plans, in a process of tripartite dialogue and with ILO technical cooperation organized within the framework of the Decent Work Country Programmes and specific initiatives to assist the constituents.

The paper provides an account of the development of the employment relationship in Kenya, noting the role of public policy and the environment that nurtures social dialogue and collective bargaining

in the country. The paper takes the view that, progressively, discernible employment relations through tripartite cooperation and collective bargaining have played a significant role in Kenya's labour market.

The paper starts with a profile of the economy and employment situation, followed by a preview of public policy on the legal and institutional framework for employment relations, the structure of the social partners and their inter-action in tripartite and bipartite dialogue on social and economic themes that impact on relations in the workplace.

Investment into human development reinforced efforts to attract new business to the transformed city. Because of the progressive mindset of the LGU, Marikina was selected as one of the pilot areas for the ILO-CIDA sponsored project dealing with youth employability in the Philippines. The youth employability survey carried out under this project highlighted the varying circumstances and constraints to employment faced by different youth segments bringing with it the realization that a homogenous approach towards youth needed to change in favour of initiatives and interventions that addressed the needs of each group if they were to be productively engaged in existing and emerging job opportunities.
