






Agriculture is one of the most hazardous sectors in both




Manual on collective bargaining and dispute resolution in the public service

This handbook on social security is intended to assist countries that may need additional information or technical support to ratify and implement this innovative Convention (Maritime Labour Convention, 2006).


These innovations relate to the Convention's legal structure and terminology, its comprehensiveness, its areas of flexibility as well as its expanded compliance and enforcement provisions.






Climate change manifests itself in the extreme weather events that occur more frequently and with increased intensity. The communities in the calamity-
