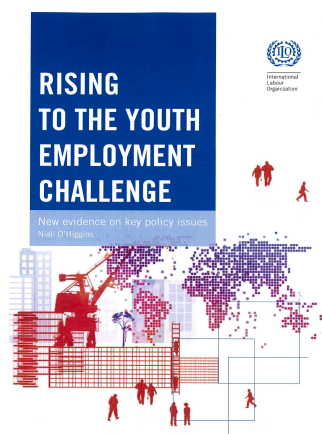

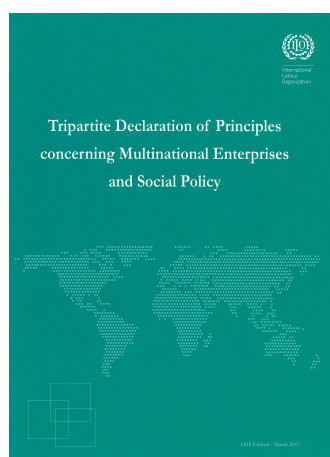

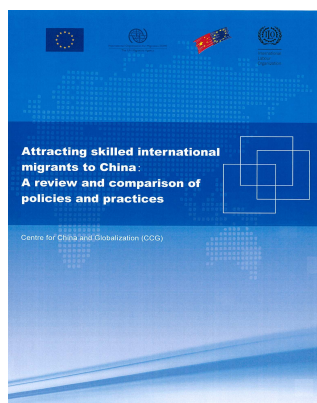
Decent work for domestic workers: Eight good practices from Asia

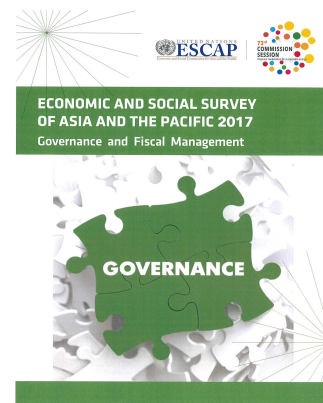
