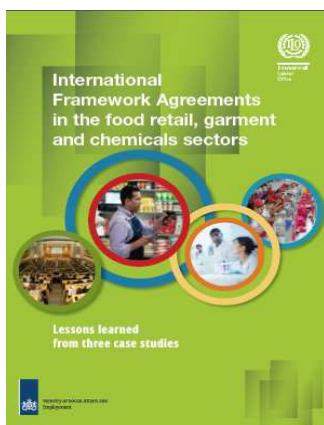
Childcare: A training manual for domestic workers' organizations

With a focus on three recent IFAs in three economic sectors, this paper is a contribution to the growing body of knowledge on international framework agreements, it complements existing and

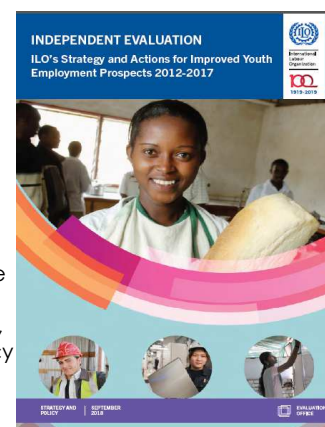

The study presents the findings of an evidence-based study on decent work deficits in domestic work in Bangladesh. It analyses the perceptions of 500 domestic workers surveyed in Dhaka, among them 375 serve as live-in and 125 as live-out domestic workers.
