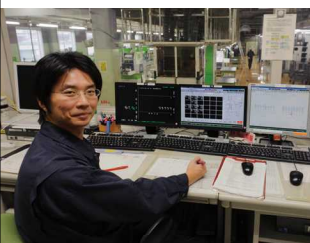


## Symposium Commemorating the ILO Centenary

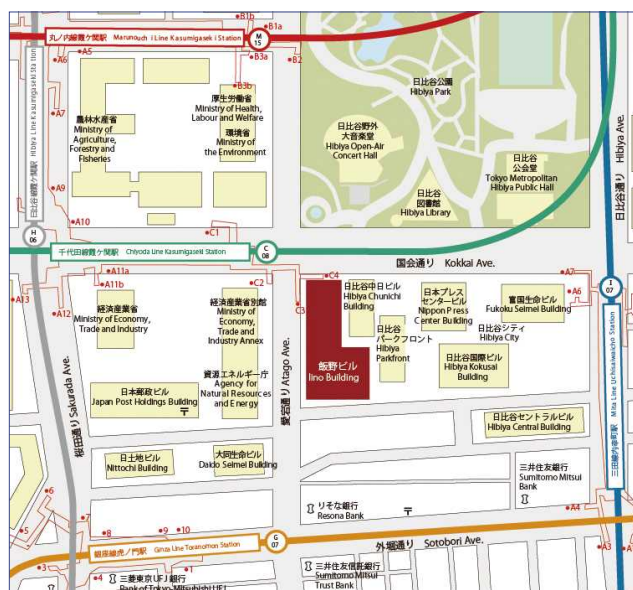

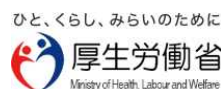
## Access Map
