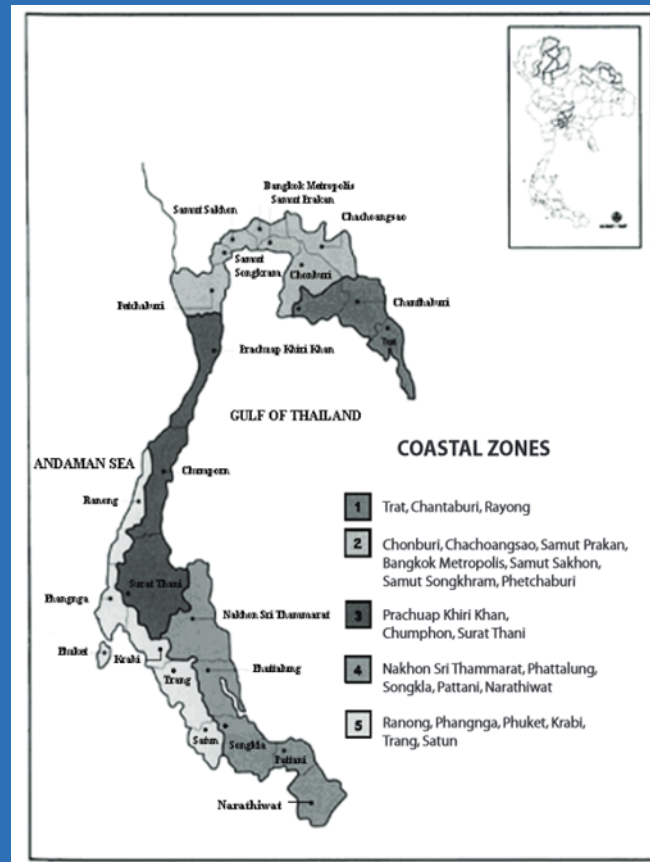

4	Support services, including strengthened worker associations	10 coastal provinces from 5 coastal zones

Implementing Sites Selection Criteria

1. Analysis of baseline official data available
 - ✓ Where high number of registered fishing vessel (PIPO data)
 - ✓ Where largest workforce in fishing and seafood industry, including largest number of migrant workers (DOE and NSO data),
 - ✓ Where (possible) incidents of labour rights violation (DLPW data and trafficking figures)
2. Mapping exercise of social partner and CSO's existing services and activities
 - Trade unions
 - CSOs
 - Industry associations

ILO field office in Phang Nga was proposed based on baseline data above and agreed by consensus in the July 2016 Task Force meeting. Phang Nga provides ready access to target provinces in Gulf and Andaman zones and is home to the Region 3 Naval Base.
