# **News Round-up**

### Youth Employment Month

The ILO declared March to be Youth Employment Month. Activities were held to highlight youth employment issues worldwide, including 10 national events in Asia and the Pacific - including in China, India, Indonesia, Pakistan, Philippines, Sri Lanka, Thailand, Timor Leste and Viet Nam. In addition the ILO has launched a competition for young film-makers to show how the global jobs crisis is affecting the lives of youth. Young people (aged 18-29) are invited to submit two minute videos by 10 April. The winners will be invited to Geneva to present their videos and attend the ILO Youth Employment Forum, 23-25 May.

### ILO, Australia and Timor-Leste Strengthen Technical Cooperation
