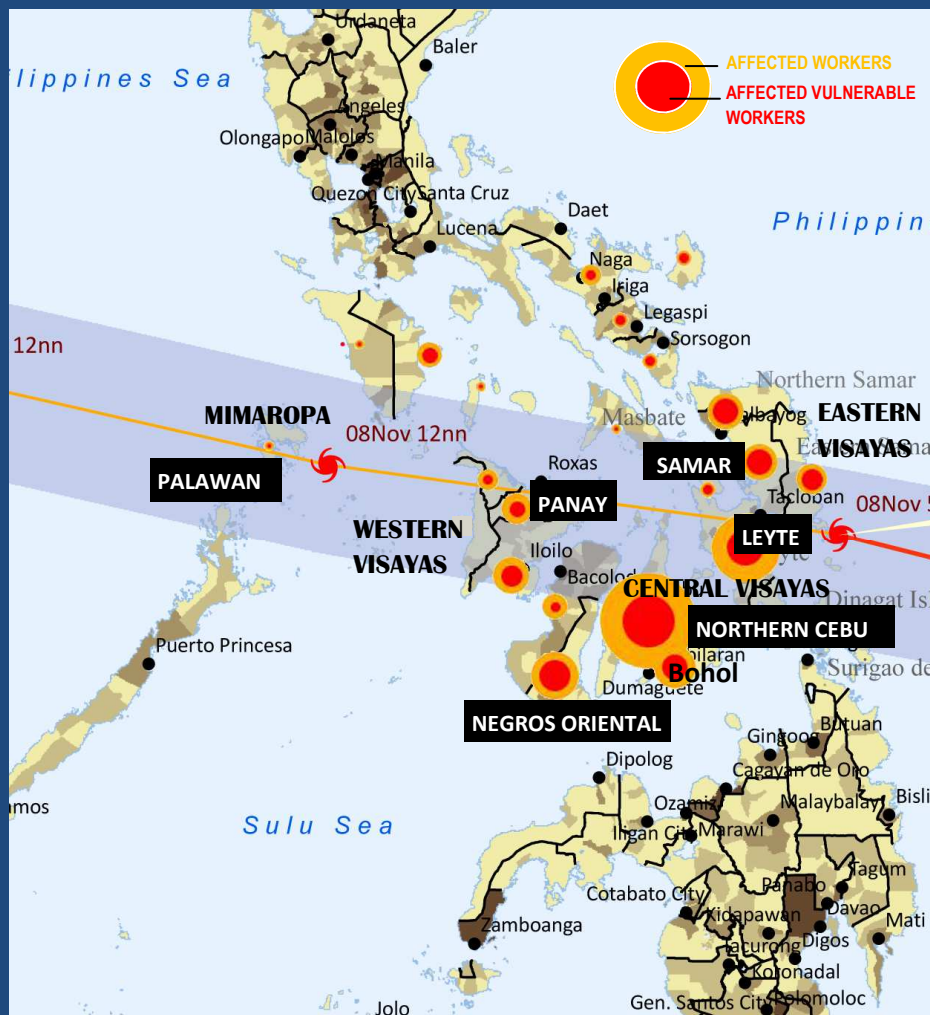

Typhoon Haiyan (Yolanda) first made landfall on 8 Nov 2013 in Guiuan, Eastern Samar province with maximum sustained winds of 235 km/h and wind gusts at 275 km/h. Haiyan made subsequent landfalls in Tolosa south of Tacloban City, Leyte province, Daanbantayan and Bantayan Island, Cebu province, Concepcion, Iloilo province and Busuanga, Palawan.

Members of ILO Assessment Team are currently deployed in Palawan, Panay Island, Negros Oriental, Northern Cebu, Samar and Leyte.

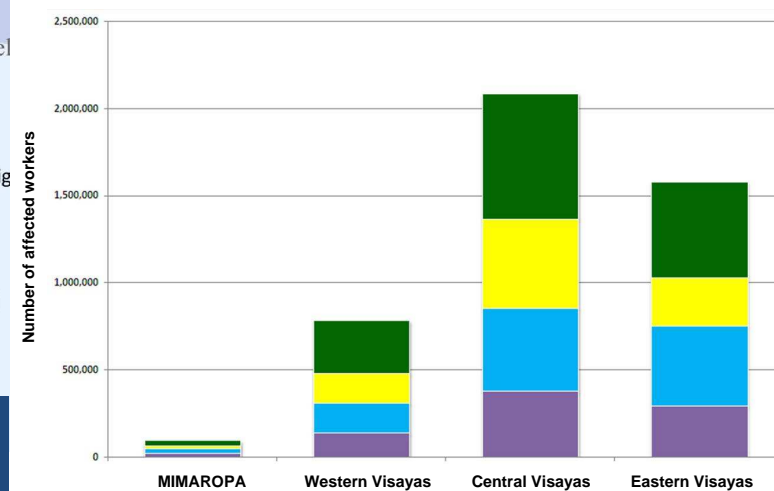
