Background

 Located in Yemen; in governorates of Sana'a, Haidada, Ibb, Dhamar and Taiz; managed from SPARK Sana'a Office; implementation partners include YLDF, YEFE, and agri-finance institutions

- Addresses three inter-linked problems:
 - Food security
 - (Rural) youth un- and under-employment
 - Government legitimacy and stability

Background

Addresses these problems through:

- (1)Strengthening capacities of partners and stakeholders in selected agricultural value chains
- (2)Creating jobs and developing enterprises with a focus on young women and men and groups that may endanger stability if excluded from economic participation
- (3)Increasing the legitimacy of government and enhancing its role in economic and food security

Project Description

Description of the intervention:

 intended beneficiaries: (potential) entrepreneurs in strawberry, dates, and honey chains; unemployed youth with skills miss-match; local and national authorities

Number of beneficiaries:

225 businesses supported, 900 direct jobs created,

Project Description

Programme components:

- (Agri) Business Development Services provision
- Improving supply of financial services
- Improving policies and dialogue for SME and chain development
- Technical skills programmes and TVET curriculum reform
- Internship and apprenticeship programmes in chains

Timeline of rollout:

- -2013: value chain selection and analyses, conflict-analysis, stakeholder meetings, training programmes development, household and producer baseline surveying, security delays
- -2014-mid 2016: interventions roll-out

Preliminary Research Ideas

Research questions:

- Does a value chain development approach lead to reduced youth unemployment and increased agricultural production in rural Yemen?
- Is there an impact of reduced youth unemployment and increased food security on government legitimacy and stability?

Preliminary Research Ideas

- No research designs yet in mind for ABC; but for other SPARK programmes with similar components: RDD (Business Start-up Centre Ramallah and Monrovia) and RCT (Cooperative Support Programme Rwanda)
- Good scope for incorporating evaluation into current program design: implementation is through SPARK and partners; baseline survey starting; significant programme duration for observing changes in outcomes
