

Indonesia: Training for Trade Unions

17-20 May 2010

- The first training in Indonesia was provided to trade unions. The main objective of the training is to promote the technical capacity of trade unions in Indonesia by reinforcing their understanding on basic concepts of international trade and employment so that they can effectively participate in a high level national policy training which is planned to take place as part of the European Union-sponsored ILO project on “Assessing and Addressing the Employment Effects of International Trade”. The training was officially opened by the Deputy Director of the ILO Jakarta, Mr. Peter van Rooij, who also explained about the project and its activities. This training was directed to the trade unionists.
 - There are four confederations of trade union registered in the country. The project invited three participants from each confederation. In all we had eleven (11) training participants. The confederations were very interested to have their members participated in the training course as they are fully aware that the issue of international trade is very critical to be understood.
