Determination of Minimum Wage for Workers/Employees in the Textile, Garment and Footwear Industries for 2017

- Having seen Sub-decree 283 OrNKr.BK dated 14 November 2014 on Organization and Functioning of the Ministry of Labur and Vocational Training
- Having seen Sub-decree No. 135 OrNKr.BK dated 22 September 2015 on Adjustment to Article 7 of the Sub-decree No. 47 OrNKr.BK dated 11 May 2006 on the Composition and Functioning of the Labour Advisory Committee
- Having seen the Statement of the Labour Advisory Committee dated 29 September 2016
- According to the wise recommendation of Samdech Techo Prime Minister

Decides

Article 1:

Add US\$5 (five) to the US\$148 (one hundred forty eight) proposed by the Labour Advisory Committee as a minimum wage per month for workers/employees in the textile, garment and footwear industries for 2017.

The minimum wage for workers/employees in the textile, garment and footwear industries for 2017 shall be officially set at US\$153 (one hundred fifty three) per month.

Article 2:

- 1- Set a minimum wage for probationary workers/employees at US\$148 (one hundred forty eight) per month. After probation, the workers/employees shall receive a minimum wage of US\$153 (one hundred fifty three) per month.
- 2- Workers/employees who are paid according to the quantities produced (piece-rate) shall receive their wage based on the actual quantities produced. If the quantities produced exceed the wage stipulated in Point 1 of Article 2 above, the workers/employees shall receive their wage according to the exceeding quantities. But if it is lower than the wage stipulated in Point 1 of Article 2 above, the employer shall add any amount to make it US\$148 (one hundred forty eight) per month for probationary workers/employees and US\$153 (one hundred fifty three) per month for workers/employees after probation.

Article 3:

Other benefits that workers/employees have received so far shall be kept the same.

Article 4:

The minimum wage as stipulated in Article 2 above shall be effective from 01 January 2017.

Article 5:

Any regulation contrary to this Prakas shall be abrogated.

Article 6:

Cabinet Chief, Director General of the General Department of Administration and Finance, Director General of the General Department of Labour, the Labour Advisory Committee and all units under the supervision of the Ministry as well as professional organizations, workers/employees and employers in the textile, garment and footwear industries shall implement this Prakas in an effective manner from the date of signature.
