Ministry Of Manpower And Emigration
Decree No. 115 Of The Year 2003
Determining The Works That Are Intermittent By
Their Nature And In Which The Worker May Stay
At The Place Of Work More Than Ten Hours A Day,
Providing His Stay Shall Not Exceed Twelve Hours A Day

The Minister of Manpower and Emigration,

After thoroughly reviewing Article No. (82) of the Labour Law as promulgated by Law No. 12 of the year 2003,

DECREES THE FOLLOWING

Article : 1

The worker may stay at the place of work more than ten hours with a maximum of twelve hours a day, in the following works. The rest period shall be considered within the hours of his stay at work.

- 1- Transport of passengers and goods by land, railways or inland water courses, or by air. This will include working at airports.
- 2- Ship mooring, searchlights, and ship repair works during transit of the ships through the Suez Canal.
- 3- Work in ports on sea tugboats, and water barges and lighters, fuel, maneuver and cargo, and their captains, mechanics, stokers, and sailors, as well as the cargo halls seamen.
- 4- Working at the rest houses, residence places for workers and the unmarried, and at the clubs attached to the establishments.
- 5- Storekeepers works, and cotton press establishments affairs.
- 6- Working in farm crops affairs.
- 7- Working in the vegetables, fruits, and fish wholesale field.

- 8- Working in the field of furniture catering and leasing the Articles for marriage feasts and funeral ceremonies.
- 9- Working in the field of undertaking the dead.
- 10- Working in pharmacies.

Article : 2

All previous text contradicting the provisions of the present decree shall be superseded.

Article : 3

The present decree shall be published in the Egyptian Wakayeh / Government Bulletin, and shall come into force effective the day following the date of its publication.
