

# ORDER NO. 6/1976

# RESPECTING INDUSTRIES AND DANGEROUS OCCUPATIONS HARMFUL TO HEALTH OF JUVENILES

The Minister for Health;

in pursuance of Article 51 of the Labour Law for the Private Sector, 1976 promulgated by Amiri Decree Law No. 23/1976;

and of the Schedule with respect to occupational diseases attached to the Social Insurance Law promulgated by Decree Law No. 24/1976;

and with the agreement of the Minister for Labour and Social Affairs;

#### ORDERS

## Article. 1

Subject to the provisions of Article 42 of the above mentioned Labour Law for the Private Sector, 1976 juveniles under the age of 16, shall be employed only under the conditions provided for in Article 51 of this Law and in occupations other than the following:

- working in quarries and all the works pertaining to prospecting of minerals and stones;
- works involving any material connected with radiation activities or x-rays;
- works resulting in exposure to dust of asbestos or cotton;
- industry engaged in prospecting and refining oil;
- work such as in bakery ovens or such other furnaces that are used for melting metallurgical materials or refining or smelting them;
- the aluminimum industry;
- occupations related to the industry or storage of explosives;
- glass industry;
- industry for the manufacture of bricks, tiles and cutting of marble and such other stones:
- forging, filing and fittings as well as auto-mechanical works;
- work connected with materials or components provided for in the schedule for occupational diseases attached to the aforementioned Social Insurance Law and which may result in poisoning due to its use or dealing with them or exposure to their dust, vapours or fumes of materials contained therein.

- welding with oxy-acetylene and arc welding;
- use of car spray paint;
- operation and control of mixing and pasting in the manufacture and repair of electrical batteries;
- operation and control of machinery and repairing and cleaning them while in action;
- working on cranes;
- casting of metals;
- mechanical carpentry;
- skinning and butchering of animals;
- construction, renovation, repair or pulling down of any building, ports, dock berths, canals, quays, highways, tunnels, breaches, major drainage complex es, drains, wells, cables, telephone installations, electrical installations, plant for generation of gas, water desalination and distribution;
- works involving generation, distribution, transmission of electricity and an manner of mechanical energy;
- manufacture of ice;
- freezing premises;
- industry connected with filling of gas in cylinders under pressure;
- carrying weights of more than 20 kilogrammes.

### Article 2

This Order shall come into operation from the date of its issue and it shall be published in the Official Gazette.
