Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>BKTF (All Together against Child Trafficking) members conducted an anti-forced child begging campaign in Tirana, during the month of June 2007, including marking of the World Day against Child Labour. The campaign focused on the idea that giving money may lead to keep children in the streets by encouraging parents to continue to use them as bread winners rather than making sure they go to school. There are many examples where the funds collected are used by parents and/or children for alcohol and drug consumption. The campaign raised the public awareness about the issue of street working children, including child trafficking, encouraged people to behave with respect and dignity with child beggars, encouraged the general public to address children's concerns from a child-rights perspective and to use alternatives for the best interest of the child (referral of children to relevant authorities and services).</p> <p>The main activities of the campaign were the following:</p> <p>Launching the event. The members of BKTF coalition, local authorities (Municipality of Tirana) and the central government (Ministry of Labour, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Interior) launched the anti-forced begging campaign through a big concert in the main square of Tirana with the participation of working children and children at risk from Tirana. This activity was funded by two NGOs, i.e. Terre des Hommes and Arsis, and the Municipality of Tirana.</p> <p>Awareness-raising materials. Leaflets, posters, adhesive posters, a TV spot and radio jingles were produced by a professional studio. This activity was funded by OSCE.</p> <p>Information dissemination. A team of social work students distributed leaflets and reached out the people during the anti-begging campaign during the afternoon rush hours, throughout June. The slogan "Stop child forced begging" and information on the ways to be used by common people in order to help unprotected children working in the streets (such as the national toll free number 0 800 12 12 connected to a network of social services made available by the Ministry of Interior from October 2006 to denounce cases of trafficking, including begging) were posted up on boards placed on the city lightening pillars in Tirana and at Rinas Airport. Also, adhesive posters were placed on the buses of the Ring Line in Tirana. In addition, leaflets including information on the ways to help the unprotected children working in the streets were distributed during a street campaign conducted by at least 50 volunteers (students of the Faculty of Social Workers) who discussed with the passers-by / people interested in the subject. Costs were covered by Terre des Hommes and the Greek NGO – ARSIS.</p> <p>ILO-IPEC Albania funded the rent of three buses which circulated in Tirana for 25 days in June 2007 with big posters against child forced begging and information on the ways to be used by common people in order to help unprotected children working in the streets. This activity was carried out under the overall supervision of Tirana Municipality. As the buses circulated at least 12 hours per day, a higher</p>

	<p>visibility of the campaign was ensured and that led to an increased awareness of the general public as concerns child beggars.</p> <p>Media. The media was part of the campaign, ensuring the coverage at local, regional and national levels. Five TV programmes were broadcasted. Radio jingles were broadcasted by national and local radio stations during the four-week campaign.</p>

Summary of activities and outcomes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> 30 May 2007 – A Review Meeting on CLMS impact during the first phase of the project was organized in Sofia by the Child Labour Unit and CARE Bulgaria – an IPEC partner organization - with 30 stakeholders from both local and central authorities – partners from the four pilot municipalities of 3 municipalities in Sofia and Kurdjali, Ministry of Labour and Social Policy, State Agency for Child Protection, Agency for Social Assistance, General Labour Inspection and others. The discussion was focused on the Good Practices documented during the piloting phase, the tools produced and future steps for the replication of CLMS. ILO press release posted on 4 websites – UNDP, Ministry of Labour and Social Policy, State Agency for Child Protection and General Labour Inspection. The website on WDACL in Bulgarian was created and is operational - http://12june.youthbg.net/. ILO fact sheets, local reports, photos, the press release and other materials on CL in agriculture are posted. The site will also be used during the second phase of the project. SCREAM based events were organized in 9 municipalities in Bulgaria (where CL in agriculture is common) for the local communities, for 881 children, 76 teachers in 11 schools and 190 parents and local stakeholders. Children used Collage, Art Competition and Creative writing modules to express themselves on the subject of child labour and WFCL in agriculture. The local communities were involved in street parades (Kurdjali) and activities carried out at the local House of Culture (Pavlikeni). Media coverage: <u>Central</u> - IPEC/NPM had an interview at Central Radio Horizont, on 12 June at 10.20 a.m. <u>Local</u> – news on three local radio stations and articles in three local Newspapers (в-к «Нов живот», в-к «Арда нюз» http://ardanews.kardjali.com/) and news on local cable TVs. ILO brochures on the WDACL 2007 were translated into Bulgarian, printed in 750 copies, out of which 300 were disseminated (the remaining will be used during the second phase of the project). The ILO original posters were disseminated to partner organizations at central and local levels.

Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>The observance of the World Day Against Child Labour (WDACL), 2007 <i>Harvest for the Future: Agriculture without Child Labour</i> began this year in Cambodia on 01 June 2007, a day which is traditionally observed as Children's Day in the country. Child labour and particularly the issue of child labour in Agriculture was significantly highlighted during the events of the Children's Day on 01 June 2007, in a public meeting which was presided over by H.E. Mr. Sok An, Deputy Prime Minister, Minister of the Council of Ministers and Representative of Samdech Hun Sen, Prime Minister of Cambodia.</p> <p>At the public meeting held in Phnom Penh that day, and attended by many hundreds of children, and in which senior officials of the Government, the Diplomatic Corps, International and local NGOs, UN Agencies such as UNICEF and ILO, teachers, etc. were present, the issue of child labour and particularly child labour in Agriculture and the WDACL was highlighted through many posters, banners and slogans highlighting the need to end child labour and for all children to be in schools. The issue was also highlighted in the address made to children by H.E. Mr. Sok An, Deputy Prime Minister, as well as in the address of H.E. H.E. Ith Samheng, Minister Ministry of Social Affairs, Veterans and Youth Rehabilitation and in the address of Mr. M. P. Joseph Chief Technical Advisor, Time Bound Programme Support Project.</p> <p>In every sense therefore the momentum for the WDACL began to be built up with the Children's day and rightfully ended on June 12, the World Day Against Child Labour.</p> <p>The events of June 12 the World Day against Child Labour (WDACL), 2007 was jointly organized in Cambodia by the Department of Child Labour, Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training and the Department of Youth, and the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports with technical and financial support provided by the ILO IPEC (Time Bound Programme Support Project and Mekong Sub-Regional Project to combat Trafficking in Children and Women), Employers' Organization (CAMFEBA), trade union (PACT Against Child Labour), UNICEF, World Vision, Cambodia, World Education.</p> <p>The main events were held on 12 June 2006, in Phnom Penh, the capital city of Cambodia, though separate events were also held in the provincial cities of Sihanoukville, Kampot, Kep, Kampong Cham, Siem Reap and Poipet.</p> <p>It began with a rally of over 500 school children and rehabilitated child labourers in the morning, marching through the heart of Phnom Penh carrying banners, posters etc. and raising slogans against child labour and releasing balloons on the occasion. It was followed by a more formal meeting where the Minister for Labour, two Members of Parliament, the Under Secretary of State from the Ministry of Agriculture, the representatives of employers and workers organisations, the UNICEF, venerable Monks from different parts of the country addressed a distinguished audience that included children and rehabilitated child labourers.</p> <p>The launch of development of the Second Joint World Bank, UNICEF, ILO Report on child labour in Cambodia under the auspices of the <i>Understanding Children's' Work</i> Project, Rome, brought a special significance to the day. A Role play on child labour by</p>

children, the testimonies of two rehabilitated child labourers, a painting competition on child labour by children etc. added colour and a children's touch to the events. The day ended with a press conference, addressed by the Secretary of State of the Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training and with representative of the Ministry of Education etc, employers and workers organisations etc.

The following is a detailed account of the main activities and events conducted to observe the WDACL on 12 June this year:

1) Telecast of an Open Forum Discussion on Child Labour and Child Labour in Agriculture in Cambodia:

An Open Forum discussion on child labour with special emphasis on child labour in agriculture was recorded on 8 June 2007 at the TV, Kampuchea (TVK) studio by TVK with support of the Department of Child Labour of the Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training and IPEC's TBP Support Project. Her Excellency Ms. Prak Chantha, Secretary of State, Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training and Chairperson of National Sub Committee on Child Labour, Mr. Im Samruol, from the Cambodian Federation of Employers' and Business Associations, CAMFEBA; Mr. Chuon Mom Thol, trade union leader and President, PACT Against Child Labour; Mr. MP Joseph, Chief Technical Advisor IPEC; Ms. Sun Samphors, a 17 year old rehabilitated child domestic labourer, Mr. Beng Simeth, World Bank. Ms. Nong, Thuok, from TVK Moderated the discussion.

The Forum was attended questions by around 50 students from schools and universities in Phnom Penh and included rehabilitated child labourers who were now in the Community Learning Centres set up under the an Action Programme of the TBP Support Project. The issues that were discussed at the Forum included

- the theme of the WDACL this year focussing on agriculture
- how the theme fits into the Cambodian context
- the differences between child work, child labour and the worst forms of child labour
- the causes, consequences and trends on child labour in Cambodia
- government efforts to eliminate child labour, specially its worst forms
- Employers' and Workers' Organizations rationale for working against child labour and their roles
- the relationship between child labour and poverty.
- the role of the World Bank in breaking the cycle of child labour and poverty
- the roles of ILO IPEC in eliminating child labour in Cambodia

The open forum was telecast repeatedly by TVK from 9-12 June 2007 and many hundreds of thousands of Cambodians would have seen and heard the TV discussions, increasing their understanding and knowledge about child labour in the country and the country's efforts to combat it.

2) Children Rally Against Child Labour:

A Children's Rally against Child Labour was organized in the morning of June 12. Starting from Independence Monument on Sihanouk Blvd, which is the heart of the Phnom Penh, the rally wound its way to the Imperial Hotel on the Mekong river side. Over 500 children (including 100 rehabilitated child labourers and 400 school children), participated in the Rally. Buddhist monks from various provinces, representatives from the Government, International Agencies, NGOs, etc also joined in the Rally, holding placards with messages against child labour and carrying banners and balloons with messages against child labour, especially in agriculture.

At the conclusion of the Rally on the Mekong Riverside, guests including Her Excellency Ms. Prak Chantha, Secretary of State, Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training and Chairperson of the National Sub Committee on Child Labour, His Excellency Mr. Hou Sry, Member of Parliament representing Phnom Penh, representatives of employers and workers organisations, NGOs etc. were present to meet the children and indicate their solidarity with the objectives of the Rally.

A song on child labour specially composed and set to music for the World Day was performed by the school children at the venue. H.E Ms. Prak Chantha thereafter addressed to children and stressed on the trends of child labour in agriculture globally and in Cambodia, its causes and consequences, and the need to address it.

The balloons with different messages against child labour, especially in agriculture were released and they went up in the air, to shouts of hurrah from the children.

3) A Painting Competition on Child Labour for Children:

A painting competition on child labour for children drawn not only from the regular schools in Phnom Penh but also from the amongst the rehabilitated child labourers who had been enrolled into Community Learning Centres was held the previous week. Over 100 children participated in the competition which was conducted by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports. A panel of judges from Government Ministries, NGOs and the ILO adjudged the competition and the best 5 paintings were selected for Prizes. The Prizes were awarded to the winners during the main event on June 12, described below.

4) The Main Event:

The main event thereafter took place. It was graced by the presence of H.E. Mr. Vong Sauth, Minister, Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training, Members of National Assembly H.E. Mrs. Ho Naun, and H.E. Mr. Hou Sry; Senior Officials of the Royal Government of Cambodia, H.E. Mrs. Prak Chantha, Secretary of State, and Chairperson of National Sub Committee on Child Labour, Ms. Van Porlim, President of Women's Association of Small and Medium Business and Chairperson of Dedicated Group on Child Labour, CAMFEBA; Ms. Chorn Sokha, Trade Union leader and Vice President of PACT Against Child Labour and President of Civil Society Network Against Child Labour; H.E Mr. Nou Muth, Under Secretary of State, Ministry of Agriculture; Mr. Phan Sokim, Director, Department of Youth, Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports, Venerable monks; Mr. Steve Harknett, UNICEF representative; Mr. MP Joseph, Chief Technical Advisor, ILO-IPEC TBP Cambodia. Representatives of other Government Ministries, UN agencies, diplomatic corps, NGOs, civil society, children, rehabilitated child labourers, the media were also present and participated in this main event.

It is significant that that the event was the outcome of the joint efforts led by the Department of Child Labour, Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training, the Department of Youth, Ministry of Education Youth and Sports, ILO IPEC (Time Bound Programme Support Project and Mekong Sub-Regional Project to combat Trafficking in Children and Women), Employers' Organization (CAMFEBA), the trade union joint body PACT Against Child Labour, UNICEF, World Vision-Cambodia, and World Education.

The event was facilitated by a Master of Ceremony, Mr. Phan Sokim, Director of Youth Department, MoEYS.

The event started with the remarks and introduction to the WDACL 2007 of Mr. MP Joseph, CTA, TBP Support Project, who explained the significance of the WDACL 2007 and the special focus on child labour in agriculture. Thereafter, a power point presentation in Khmer and English on tackling child labour in agriculture: WDACL 2007 and beyond was delivered by Mr. Ouk Sisovann, Sr. National Programme Officer, TBP Support Project.

The presentation was followed by the testimonies of two children, one who was formerly a child labourer in porter sector in Poi Pet, Banteay Meanchey (Ms. Thai Phuong Malay) and the other who was working as a domestic child labourer in Phnom Penh (Ms. Huy Syna) and who through ILO IPEC support had been rehabilitated and were now studying in the Community Learning Centers set up in the TBP Support Project Project. The testimonies of hte the children were very poignant describing as it did the difficulties they went through working as child labourers.

The anecdotal remarks by the former child laborers were followed by the remarks of trade unions' and employers' representatives, Ms. Chorn Sokha, Vice-Present of PACT Against Child Labour and President of Civil Society Network Against Child Labour, and Ms. Van Porlim, President of Women's Association of Small and Medium Business and Chairperson of Dedicated Group on Child Labour, CAMFEBA. Their remarks focussed on the significance and roles of workers and employers, and their organizations in combating child labour, their work and achievements so far and on their future activities for achieving the goals and targets set by the Royal Government of Cambodia for child labour reduction by 2015 and the ILO target for eliminating the worst forms of child labour by 2016.

H.E. Mr. Vong Sauth, Minister, Ministry of Labour and Vocational Training, thereafter, addressed the Meeting focusing on the significance of the WDACL 2007 and its theme of eliminating child labour in agriculture. He emphasized that in Cambodia child labour in agriculture is a major problem, though it does not get the type of attention that

perhaps other forms of child labour receives. Some studies have shown that 9 out of every 10 working children could be in the agricultural or related sectors. Thus the theme of the elimination of child labour in Agriculture holds a special significance for Cambodia, he said. During the last few years in Cambodia, child labour has not only been recognized as a social issue of great importance to the country, but also as an issue that can adversely impact human resources and the growing economic potential of the country. At the same time (and particularly in the last couple of years) the Government of Cambodia has taken many important steps for the elimination of child labour. Apart from ratifying ILO Conventions 182 and 138 and drafting a National Plan of Action on the Elimination of the Worst Forms of Child Labour, in the last year and half the Government in collaboration with the ILO, and other agencies have taken many steps at the community level against child labour, which has begun to bear fruit. These actions whose impacts are beginning to be visible are spread over 6 sectors of child labour covering 7 provinces. At the same time, there have been similar responses and interventions against child labour from employers' and workers organisations in the country and from many different agencies including UNICEF, World Bank, NGOs like World Education, World Vision, etc. The sum total of these outcomes is beginning to make an impact against child labour in the country and beginning to show that with the right mix of policies and actions, child labour can end.

5) Children's Role Play on Child Labour:

The Minister's speech was followed by a Role Play on child labour by 7 beneficiary children under funds of the US DOL provided to World Education and who had come through an NGO from Prey Veng. The Role Play which was greatly acclaimed by the audience focused on the problems of a small child who had been sent to work in the city as in a middle class home as a domestic labourer.

6) Launching of the Development of the Second Joint ILO, WB, UNICEF Report on Child Labour in Cambodia:

The occasion was also used to formally launch the development of the Second Inter-Agency Report on Child Labour in Cambodia, under the Joint ILO, WB, UNICEF Understanding Children's Work (UCW) Project. The development of the Second Report which would focus on **Ending the Worst Forms of Child Labour in Cambodia by 2016**, was launched by Mr. Steve Harknett UNICEF's Representative, and Technical Advisor, Social Policy and Institutional Strengthening Ministry of Social Affairs, Veterans and Youth Rehabilitation. It may be recalled that the Inter Agency Report on Child Labour in Cambodia, called the ***Children's Work in Cambodia: A Challenge to Growth and Poverty Reduction*** that had been jointly prepared by the ILO, UNICEF and the World Bank was launched during the WDACL 2006.

7) Award of Prizes and Certificates:

Members of the National Assembly and representatives of the Government, led by H.E., Mr. Vong Sauth, Minister H.E. Mrs. Ho Naun, Member of Parliament, H.E. Mr. Hou Sry, Member of Parliament, H.E. Mrs. Prak Chantha, Secretary of State of the MLVT, and H.E. Mr. Nou Muth, Under Secretary of State, Ministry of Agriculture presented prizes to the 5 winners of the children's painting competition on Child Labour. The Honorable Guests also gave away Certificates of Membership to the new members of the Civil Society Network Against Child Labour from Phnom Penh, Sihanoukville, Kampong Cham and Siem Reap. They also gave away Certificates of Recognition to the Implementing Agencies and Executing Agencies of the Action Programmes on Child Labour of IPEC's TBP Support Project.

8) Joint Press Conference:

A joint press conference was held in the afternoon of June 12 where H.E. Mrs. Prak Chantha, Secretary of State, and Chairperson, National Sub Committee on Child Labour, Ms. Sou Monivark, Deputy Secretary-General, CAMFEB; Ms. Chorn Sokha, Vice-President, PACT Against Child Labour and Chairperson of the Civil Society Network Against Child Labour; Mr. MP Joseph, Chief Technical Advisor, ILO IPEC; and Mr. Ruy Kimtek, Deputy Director, Municipal Department of Education in Phnom Penh were present and responded to the questions on the WDACL 2007 and on child labour.

9) Press Coverage:

The many activities of the WDACL 2007, had a good press coverage thereafter, with many newspapers reporting the events with photographs, write ups etc. and many TV channels covering the events quite extensively the following days.

	<p>In all, the events of the World Day Against Child Labour that was observed in Cambodia on 12 June 2007, was most appropriate considering that the theme of this Year's World Day Against Child Labour was, Harvest for the Future: Agriculture without child labour. Résumé des activités et résultats	<p>La journée mondiale de lutte contre le travail des enfants 2007 s'est déroulée en Côte d'Ivoire, à l'intérieur du pays, à Gonaté, dans la sous préfecture de Daloa.</p> <p>Ce déplacement dans le pays profond, initié par le projet BIT-IPEC-LUTRENA, en partenariat avec le Comité national de lutte contre le trafic et l'exploitation des enfants (CNTLEE – Ministère de la Famille et des Affaires sociales) et la Cellule focale de lutte contre le trafic et le travail des enfants (CFLTEE – Ministère de l'Agriculture), répondait au souci d'une mobilisation forte en rapport avec le thème de la journée qui portait sur « le travail des enfants dans l'agriculture ». Aussi, les activités marquant cette journée se sont déroulées à Gonaté, importante localité cosmopolite sise en zone forestière et grande productrice de cacao, de café et de bananes.</p> <p>La Journée proprement dite a commencé vers 10 heures sur la place de la grande gare du village par une « Marche contre le travail et la traite des enfants dans l'agriculture ». Parmi ces marcheurs, on remarquait notamment des enfants scolarisés, déscolarisés ou non scolarisés en Tricots portant une Croix rouge et le Message « Non à la Traite et au travail, oui à la scolarisation ». A ces enfants, se sont joints des villageois, les autorités préfectorales, administratives et coutumières (secrétaire général de préfecture représentant le préfet de région de Daloa), les sous-préfets de Daloa et Bédiala, les directeurs régionaux et départementaux de l'agriculture, le représentant du ministre de l'Agriculture, le représentant du ministre de la famille, le secrétaire général de la coopérative agricole Kavokiva, les représentants du BIT, de la fondation ICI, du projet /GTZLTTE et différents responsables d'ONG de protection des enfants et de lutte contre le travail des enfants.</p> <p>La marche qui s'est déroulée sur environ 1km a conduit les manifestants sur la grande place de récréation de la grande école primaire du village.</p> <p>Plusieurs discours dont celui du représentant du préfet de région, du conseiller spécial du Premier ministre chargé de l'agriculture et du Directeur des productions agricoles représentant le ministre de l'agriculture ont été livrés à l'assistance. Les intervenants se sont engagés pour l'assainissement de l'agriculture ivoirienne de toute forme de travail des enfants et surtout pour la scolarisation des enfants comme solution essentielle au travail des enfants. « Les enfants à l'école, les parents aux champs », a à son tour recommandé le représentant du BIT.</p> <p>Des scènes de théâtre montrant les souffrances des enfants travailleurs dans l'agriculture ont été jouées par des enfants du village, suscitant tantôt de l'émotion tantôt de l'indignation dans la foule. Ces sketches ont été ensuite suivis de messages d'explication et de sensibilisation contre le travail des enfants par des membres de comités de vigilance contre la traite des enfants du village.</p> <p>L'un des points marquants de cette journée a été sans aucun doute la cérémonie de mise à disposition de 140 kits scolaires pour appuyer la scolarisation des enfants démunis dans les villages de Gonaté, Tiébadougou, Gobazra, Bognonzra et Koudougou. 	<p><u>Sixth World Day Promotes A Mass Movement against child labour:</u> The Sixth World Day Against Child Labour witnessed an unprecedented turn out of people from various walks of life to say no to child labour. It was observed in earnestness in all the five INDUS Project states and districts, with the participation of over 300,000 government functionaries, parents, representatives of employers and workers organisations, NGO representatives, social activists and media.</p> <p><u>High Level Policy Debate at National Level :</u> This World Day witnessed a high level policy debate on child labour in agriculture. Professor G.K. Chadha, Member, Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister of India, released a book titled "Child Labour Facts and Figures: An Analysis of Census 2001" brought out by INDUS Project. Speaking on the occasion Ms.Leyla Tegmo Reddy, Director and ILO Representative in India called upon all sections of society to stand up against child labour and create conditions for providing education to all children towards achieving inclusive growth.</p> <p>The book release was followed by a high level round table discussion on the theme of child labour and agriculture. Magsasy Award winner and Chairperson, National Commission for Protection of Child Rights, Dr. Shanta Sinha, chaired the discussion. Professor Ravi Srivastava, Member National Commission for Enterprises in the Unorganized Sector made a theme presentation. Mr. D K Sikri, Registrar General, Census of India, Mr. Ashok Sahu, Economic Adviser, Ministry of Labour and Employment Dr. Santosh Mehrotra, Sr. Consultant (RD), Planning Commission, Mr. P.K. Ray, Officiating Director General, National Sample Survey Organization were in the panel and spoke on the occasion. Over 60 academics, researchers, statisticians, NGO activists and social partners attended the event. All the panelists and speakers appreciated the selection of the theme and complemented ILO for choosing child labour in agriculture as this year's theme for the world day.</p> <p><u>Building a momentum:</u> Five State Governments and 21 district authorities organised a series of programmes to ensure that the message against child labour reaches a large number of people in villages and cities. Political and bureaucratic commitment at the highest level was evident in that Labour ministers of</p>

Governments of Uttar Pradesh and Tamil Nadu and Minister of Handlooms, Government of Tamil Nadu, mayors, district magistrates and state heads of departments actively organised and participated in the events and pledged their commitment to eliminate child labour.

World Day Promotes mainstreaming of child labour concerns in government programmes.

Beginning in 2005, conduct of various activities on child labour on the eve of the world day against child labour has become part of the regular government activity in the state of Tamil Nadu. This year witnessed heightened activity during the world day and continued even thereafter. Successively for the third consecutive year all the government departments and district authorities observed World day Against Child Labour by taking oath to fight child labour. The state and district authorities provided the lead in holding weeklong activities and organising a series of high profile events in all major cities and in all district of Tamil Nadu. Wide scale mobilisation was undertaken to involve all members of society, including large corporate houses, employers, workers organisations, civil society organisations, teachers and school students.

A large number of government officials and factory employees throughout Tamil Nadu took a pledge against employing child labour in 30 districts. Rallies were organised in all districts. Over 60,000 children and civil society members participated in these rallies, with a mobilisation of approximately 2000 per district. In all National Child labour Project and INDUS districts children who had been mainstreamed from transitional education centres and who performed well in public examinations were felicitated. Massive media publicity was ensured through advertisements, which were released in all major newspapers, and through cable TV networks. Extensive print and television media coverage of activities was also seen.

Signature Campaign in Maharashtra: A Signature campaign was organised in the business centre in the divisional headquarter of Amaravati. About 10,000 people in a period of 12 hours signed a banner pledging that they would not employ child labour.

Awareness Rallies: Large scale awareness rallies were held in districts of Tamil Nadu, Maharashtra and Delhi. In Viruddanagar district, rallies were organised in 1000 villages, human chains formed in 20 town centres and cycle rallies in 7 towns; in Jalna, Mumbai, Gondia, Tiruванamallai, Namakkal, Tiruvallur, Satna, Jabalpur and Katni districts, about 10,000 children and 1000 parents participated in the rallies organised in the 2 km radius of INDUS Project Transitional Educational Centres.

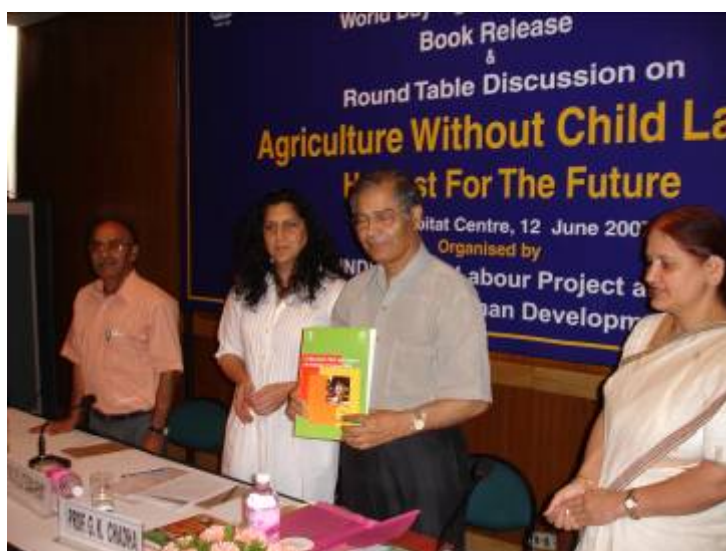
Spreading the message: The State Resource Cell, Uttar Pradesh organised an innovative campaign using an Anti-Child Labour Chariot ("Rath") – which traversed 10 districts of the state. The mobile awareness Chariot passed through 4 INDUS and 6 NCLP districts and covered a distance of 1000 km. Child Labour songs, spots and the TV documentary produced by INDUS Project was played at each stop. Following this, an interactive street play was organised to sensitise people on the issue. 10,000 appeals were distributed and 1000 posters have been displayed in key spots (bus terminals, railway stations) in districts.

Media Messaging: Special radio programmes were hosted in Maharashtra and Tamil Nadu on the theme to create awareness on World Day against Child Labour. 30 second messages on Elimination of Child labour was aired on radio throughout Tamil Nadu and Maharashtra. 22 minute Documentary film titled "Lost Childhood" was shown on Television on 12 June in many parts of Tamil Nadu. Mobile phone messaging was also organised through the largest service provider in Viruddanagar district.

Garnering Employers Commitment: Employers workshops were organised in all parts of Tamil Nadu. In Chennai, state capital of Tamil Nadu, over 100 employers and corporate houses participated and pledged their support to the cause. They were also encouraged to actively participate in child labour elimination activities both individually and by supporting state government in its efforts.

Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>JEMBER DISTRICT, EAST JAVA</p> <p>Community awareness raising, 12 and 13 June 2007 A research conducted in 2006 found that many children in Ajung and Kamal villages, Jember, East Java were engaged in the works in tobacco industry. In addition to low income of the families, reasons for this are among other low awareness of parents and children on the negative impacts of child labour and low appreciation of education. In commemorating the World Day against child labour, Yayasan Prakarsa Swadaya Masyarakat, a Jember based NGO, with support from the ILO-IPEC conducted community awareness raising activities in forms of carnivals to attract attention of the local people to the issue of child labour in their areas. Local leaders from village and sub district level were invited to directly talk to children and parents, who gathered around in the launching of the carnivals, on local problems on child labour and drop out and to encourage parents to send their children to school instead of work.</p> <p>Around 250 children, consisting of 220 school children and 30 child labourers in each village joined the carnival by walking down the village roads displaying various messages to stop child labour and to campaign schooling. 4,000 flyers conveying various messages to stop child labour were distributed to parents and adults the carnival met on its way.</p> <p>One day workshop on Tackling Child Labour in Tobacco Industry in Jember, 14 June 2007 The one day workshop was attended by key stakeholders in Jember district which included relevant government offices, NGOs, academicians, tobacco farmer association and employers, child labour themselves and parents. The workshop produced a recommendation to be submitted to the authorities in Jember on the need to tackle the problems of child labour in tobacco industry through improving economic situation of the family, increasing educational services for the children in the tobacco areas, improving labour rights and increasing awareness on the negative impacts of child labour. The workshop also proposed that the issue of child labour to be included in the local regulation on conducting business on tobacco sector. The current local regulation on tobacco has not yet included the child labour issue.</p> <p>BOGOR DISTRICT, WEST JAVA</p> <p>Public Dialog on 'Child Labour Free Bogor', 12 June The public dialog involved the representatives from Bogor District Government, member of local parliament of Bogor District, local communities, business owners, child labour and their families. The dialog focused on progress, hindrances and challenges faced in child labour elimination to achieve Child Labour Free Bogor. Prior to the public dialog, the involved parties were invited to visit child labour work places in footwear workshops and to visit ILO-IPEC supported creativity centre for children that provides various services to withdraw and prevent children from</p>

	<p>working in footwear workshop.</p> <p>During the public dialog the executive and legislative bodies in Bogor Sub district receive first hand information on the situation of child labour from community members such as child labour, parents and footwear craftsmen themselves. At the end of the dialog, joint commitment was made that included commitment to improve education, formal as well as non formal, to improve people's welfare, to prevent children from engaging in works and the government to provide education infrastructures. The public dialog has been widely covered by the local mass media in Bogor, this being very useful to raise public awareness on the issue.</p> <p>EAST KALIMANTAN</p> <p>Writing Competition on How to Tackle Child Labour Problems, May to June 2007</p> <p>The writing competition, which invited general public, journalist and students to participate, was aimed to gather ideas on ways to end child labour in East Kalimantan. The winning articles have been selected and published in Tribun Kaltim Newspaper on 12 June 2007. The competition has been a good way to raise public awareness that will help accelerate realization of child labour elimination in East Kalimantan. Ideas on solving the problems of child labour in East Kalimantan gathered will be taken into consideration by authorities in East Kalimantan in developing policies and programs to tackle child labour in this province.</p> <p>Agricultural and Plantation Fair, 24 May 2007</p> <p>In addition to the writing competition, an ILO-IPEC partner in East Kalimantan, Yayasan Padi, organized Agriculture and Plantation Fair on 24 May 2007 which exhibited various agricultural and plantation products produced by women business groups and youth business groups which have been assisted by ILO-IPEC through ILO-IPEC's partners. The exhibition is also used to provide information, through display and distribution of stickers, brochures, photos, etc) on the prohibition of employing children and the elimination of child labour, especially its worst forms. Through this exhibition the women and youth business groups developed their network with buyers as well as medium and big business owners.</p> <p>NORTH SUMATRA</p> <p>Film launching, 13 June 2007</p> <p>ILO-IPEC's partner, North Sumatra Fishery Union launched a 15 minute film picturing situation of children working in offshore fishing who work for others as well as for their parents or families. The film provides information on the reasons behind the children's involvement in off shore fishing. The message is for parents not to ask and to let their children to fish off shore. The launching was attended by key stakeholders in Bagan Asahan District where many children working in offshore fishing was found. The film will be used for awareness raising activities for general public in Bagan Asahan.</p> <p>In addition to the above, various activities were implemented at local level to commemorate WDACL 2007 such as creativity competition for children and carnivals to campaign the elimination of child labour.</p>

Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>This year, ILO Office in Japan organized WDACL related activities with 3 major events, namely (1) Child Labour Photo Exhibition; (2) 12 June Public Seminar; (3) 17 June Film & Talk Session, each of which were implemented in collaboration with a number of partner organizations.</p> <p>1. Child Labour Photo Exhibition (24 April-13 May at JICA Global Plaza & 15 May-14 June at UN Gallery)</p> <p>First part of photo exhibition was held at JICA Global Plaza in Tokyo with substantial collaborative work provided by JICA. ILO-Tokyo exhibited 50 photo & explanatory panels, showing ILO videos at the venue as part of JICA Global Plaza's special featured exhibition titled "Working Children - World Happiness and Sadness" on 17 April - 17 June 2007. JICA produced their exhibition display kit on child labour problems, with substantive inputs from ILO-Tokyo, which will be circulated and displayed at JICA public facilities located in several cities in Japan in the latter half of 2007. During the period of exhibition, a number of study tour groups of junior & senior high school students from local cities in Japan visited JICA Global Plaza to study development issues, and therefore, the record shows more than 800 students and general public (of which 370 are the study tour group students) came to see our exhibition.</p> <p>For the latter part of photo exhibition at UN Gallery, the focus was on this year's theme of WDACL, namely, "Child Labour in Agriculture", by adding some new panels on children working in the farms. In this connection, there was cooperation with the FAO Liaison Office, including FAO's explanatory and 3 photo panels in the exhibition. The significance of new international agricultural partnership (ILO, FAO, IFAD, IFPRI, IFAP, IUF) in tackling the child labour issues in agriculture was included in the message board (both English & Japanese) at the entrance. Some 600-700 people visited the exhibition at the UN Gallery.</p> <p>2. Public Forum on 12 (Tue) June Reporting session on child labour and IPEC projects in the Philippines, Nepal and India. The forum on WDACL was held at JICA Global Plaza as well in the evening (18:00-20:00), and Japan Offices of FAO, WFP and UNICEF joined ILO-Tokyo as cooperating agencies to host the forum. 80 people (NGO activists, university/senior high school students, teachers, trade unions, CSR officers of private companies) participated in the forum. In the opening, the Japanese translated version of PPT prepared by IPEC "Child Labour in Agriculture" was used, followed by ILO 2007 video show "Tackling child labour in agriculture". Also, two information sheets "Overview of CL in agriculture" and "Hazardous Child Labour" translated into Japanese, were distributed among the participants. There were two reporting sessions, one by All NTT Workers Union of Japan Study Tour members who visited the Philippines (Manila & Cebu) on 23-30 April and the</p>

	<p>other by Mr. Ishikawa, reporter of Mainichi Shimbun (daily newspaper) who spent one month and a half (mid-April to end-May) in Nepal and India to cover child labour/soldiers/trafficking/HIV-AIDS issues, etc. for their World Children Rescue campaign articles. He actually wrote 12 articles in Mainichi Shimbun and copies of these were on display on the wall at the event place. Both of the tour/mission had been arranged in cooperation with ILO Offices in the field.</p> <p>In concluding the forum, Mr. Rohrmann, Director of UNICEF Tokyo Office for Japan & the Republic of Korea summed up the issue of child labour using basic data and key elements to create environment to protect children.</p> <p>Outcome</p> <p>Through this forum, we succeeded to (1) join forces with other UN agencies and external partners, and (2) provide lively information through the eyes of the third parties on child labour issues in specific countries and what ILO does to eliminate child labour with partners in respective countries.</p> <p>3. Film & Talk Session on 17 (Sun) June: "Child Labour, Agriculture, Poverty - now in Africa"</p> <p>The event was jointly organized by ILO Office in Japan, NGO-Trade Union Forum for International Collaboration on MDGs, and Child Labour Network Japan at UN House and nearly 500 people joined the session.</p> <p>The session was opened with the ILO-IPEC presentation on "Child Labour and Agriculture". It was followed by the film viewing of "Black Gold - Wake up and smell the coffee" (featuring coffee farmers in Ethiopia / commodity trade in New York / highest quality coffee producer in Italy / consumers in UK / international negotiation at WTO, etc). Keynote speeches were made by two guest speakers, namely, Dr. Assefa Bequele, (former Director, Working Conditions and Environment Dept, ILO), Executive Director of the African Child Policy Forum and a member of the African Committee of Experts on the Rights of the Child of the African Union; and Prof. Hiroyuki Ishi at Graduate School of Hokkaido University and former Japan's Ambassador to Zambia who started his career as a journalist and recently published a book on "Children in Africa".</p> <p>Both Film and Speeches stroke the audience with reality. Both Dr. Bequele & Prof. Ishi emphasized the importance of universal and free education, gravity of effects by HIV/AIDS and armed conflicts on child labour issues in Africa.</p> <p>After the session, approx 200 participants joined the walk rally organized by Child Labour Network Japan on the main streets of Shibuya to deliver the message of "Stop Child Labour and Education for All Children in the World".</p> <p>Outcomes</p> <p>ILO-Tokyo has strengthened its partnership in working with various stakeholders in advocating child labour issues in Japan as one of the key elements of this year's activities.</p> <p>Three other initiatives related to WDACL were taken by external organizations in Japan:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> * Child Labour Network Japan (composed of NGOs and trade unions as named below on partners) has started to set up a campaign period on WDACL since last year. This year, the period was set for 12 May - 30 June 2007, and a series of 12 activities (study meetings, workshops, exhibitions, walk rallies, futsal tournament) were carried out by participating organizations during the period. * This year, major newspapers in Japan covered child labour issues and problems in Asian countries in May-June. In total, 13 articles appeared in Mainichi / Asahi / Yomiuri. * On 12 June WDACL, NHK Satellite News programme featured child labour issues for about 10 minutes starting at 23:15, and ILO video on child labour in agriculture and in mines (2006 & 2007 video) was used to start the programme with the credit to the ILO. This was done through efficient cooperation with DCOMM, HQ. Prof. Ishi was invited to comment on child labour situations in Africa. WDACL has come to be known among the media in general in Japan.

Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>The national activities to mark 2007 WDACL in Kenya were held on Wednesday 20th June 2007 following a request by the invited Chief Guest, Her Excellency the First Lady, Mrs. Lucy Kibaki to postpone the celebrations due to her unavailability on June 12th. The national planning committee considered the request realistic given the First Lady's candid commitment to the rights of Kenyan children. The WDACL was by virtue of the First Lady being the chief guest, a State Function.</p> <p>In preparing for the main event as well as the build up activities, the national planning committee expanded on the WDACL global theme to have a Kenya specific theme; <i>"children in the present, farmers in the future, stop child labour in Agriculture"</i> that was used in rallying the country against child labour in agriculture and other worst forms of child labour. The Kenya specific theme was meant to send message against hazardous child labour in agriculture as well as promote the sector as a viable socio economic sector as stipulated in the Government Strategy for Revitalizing Agriculture (SRA).</p> <p>The national event was presided by Her Excellency the First Lady at the Kitui Stadium. Kitui is a semi-arid district about 200 km from the capital city Nairobi and is one of the IPEC target districts under the TBP programme. Hazardous child labour in subsistence sub-sector is prevalent in the area. The function was attended by over 1000 children from different primary and secondary schools in Kitui district. Also present were the Minister and Permanent Secretary in the Ministry of Labour and Human Resource Development, representatives from the Central Organization of Trade Unions, Federation of Kenya Employers, Food and Agriculture Organization, the Provincial administration and other ILO implementing partners. The chief guest echoed the government commitment to improving the welfare of the Kenyan children through programmes such as increased investment in education that for the first time will see government pay tuition fees for pupils in secondary schools in addition to the free primary education programme initiated in January 2003. The First Lady said the recently launched Women Enterprise Fund will result in reduction of poverty levels thereby strengthening family socio-economic safety nets and ensuring children are not exposed to work at an early age. She called upon the Kenyan parliament to fast track passing of the Employment bill currently in parliament. The bill proposes punitive measures against perpetrators of child labour. Child labour in agriculture that denies children the opportunity to attend school was decried. The First Lady noted that despite the government funding primary education, nearly one million children are either out of school or combine work and schooling, thereby compromising their school time and quality of education</p> <p>During the event, the First Lady presented awards to journalists who have excelled in reporting on child labour. The awards were part of ILO/IPEC TBP project activities with one of the implementing partners (Association of Media Women in Kenya-AMWIK). A children football match was played to kick child labour out of Kitui and in the country. The winning and runners up teams were provided with trophies and balls for future use. The cup will be contested annually thereby ensuring the WDACL activities are commemorated each year in the district.</p> <p>The event received wide media coverage, especially the electronic media (Television and</p>

	<p>Radio). The National television broadcaster carried a 7 minutes highlight of the chief guests' message during the prime time news while the FM radio stations repeatedly aired the First Lady's message.</p> <p>On June 12th a number of activities were spearheaded by IPEC implementing partners in their respective areas of project implementation. In Eldoret, one of ILO/IPEC implementing partners, KAACR in partnership with the district child labour committee brought together over 300 children to commemorate the day. One boy child who was recently withdrawn from street work and enrolled in school shared his experience with the participants. The District Administrator promised to enforce implementation of the Children Act while the Education Officer committed to use the funds on bursary from the Town Council levies to support children withdrawn from labour. In Kwale, another IPEC target district, SOLWODI (see separate SOLWODI report attached), also an IPEC implementing partner held a procession to sensitize the community on WFCL prevalent in the district, mainly sexual exploitation of child and trafficking. This reflected the regional priorities depending on type of WFCL prevalent in an area. The event also served as a build up activity for the Day of the African Child marked on June 16th under the trafficking theme.</p> <p>Other build up activities included an editor's breakfast forum held on June 5th and attended by editors and journalists from print and electronic media houses to dialogue with stakeholders working on the elimination of child labour in Kenya. A report on media coverage of elimination of child labour in Kenya for the last two years was presented. The report challenged journalists to ensure the stories they write are well researched and reflect the immediate needs of working children. On June 6th, over 40 stakeholders, among them the United States Labour Attaché in American Embassy in Nairobi converged in Nairobi to discuss a study commissioned by ILO/IPEC Kenya entitled; "An audit of the Agriculture Legal and policy framework and the elimination of child labour in Kenya". Despite the fact that 56% of child labourers are in the agriculture sector, the sectoral policies and laws are silent on prevention and elimination of child labour in the agriculture sector. The stakeholders resolved to support policy and legal framework to ensure protection of children from hazardous work in the agriculture sector (paper will be circulated once final version is received from consultant).</p>

INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST CHILD LABOUR

SOLWODI together with the Kwale District Child Labour Committee (DCLC) planned the International Day against Child Labour. The event took place on the 12th June 2007 in Kwale district and over 2,000 people including children participated.

The event began at the Ukunda's Chief's office. The Chief and the District Labour Officer planted a tree at Ukunda chief's camp to commemorate the day. (see the below photo).



This was followed by a 5km procession along Ukunda Lunga Lunga road to the venue, Ukunda show ground. (See photo below)



Presentations were made by children from different schools. (see the photos below)



The Chief Guest was Mr. Oseno, the Kwale District Commissioner. Among other guests were the District Officer, Area Chief, Area Councillor, representative of the Provincial Children's Office, Kwale District Children's Officer, representative from Save the Children Sweden – Joyce Mwangi, Kenya Association of Hotel Keepers and Caterers (KAHC).

The Chief Guest, Kwale District Commissioner, Mr. Oseno in his speech, (see the photo below) gave a stern warning to the pubs, clubs and lodges that admit underage children, he also warned parents who are negligent of their children that they risk being charged in court.



A total of 210 T-Shirts courtesy of Australian Development Agency, Save the Children Sweden and UNICEF through SOLWODI, were printed and given to children, with a special consideration on the ones taking part in presentations like poems, songs, drama, etc.

Among other sponsors of the event through SOLWODI were SOLWODI e.V in Germany (Dr. Sr. Leah Ackerman, Solwodi Founder), Kenya Association of Tour Operators (KATO), Kaskazi Beach Hotel, Diani Sea Lodge and Diani Sea Resort (Code of Conduct signatories). They provided cash, drinking water and sodas for the participants.

Other donations were done through the District Labour Office (District Labour Officer, who is the Kwale DCLC Chairman).

Other collaborators who assisted and participated in the event were;– Ukunda and Gombato LCLCs, Education Office, Teens Watch, Provincial Administration, etc.

Local Radio Stations also participated e.g. Radio Salaam, Baraka FM and Radio Rahma. They made interviews and aired the event.

Even though this year's event was focusing on agriculture, most speakers focused on sexual exploitation of children and child trafficking. This is because sexual exploitation of children is being experienced in the area and it needs to be addressed immediately.

The event also served as a build up event for the Day of the African Child which was celebrated on 16th June 2007.

Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>Within the IPEC TORs for supporting the process of tripartite consultation on draft HCL List, the following events were organized to mark the WDACL 2007: Public discussion on the HCL List (25 -31 May 2007)</p> <p>Five regional debates on HCL List Kosovo wide were conducted by the Technical Working Group on HCL following the presentation of the first draft of the HCL List to the Kosovo Committee for Prevention and Elimination of Child Labour. 244 representatives of municipal authorities, representatives of public institutions, social partners, children, parents, affected communities and NGOs concerned with child issues participated in these debates. The recommendations from the debates were reviewed and consolidated by the Technical Working Group on HCL in a one day workshop conducted on 5 June 2007.</p> <p>On 21 June 2007 a Tripartite conference on HCL was called by the Minister of Labour and Social Welfare to agree on the List of Hazardous Child Labour in Kosovo. Participants in the conference included members of the Kosovo Committee on Prevention and Elimination of Child Labour and additional stakeholders invited on ad hoc basis (representatives of Kosovo Confederation of Trade Union -TU of Education Workers, TU of Health Workers, TU of Agrocomplex, representatives of Employers Organizations - Kosovo Chamber of Commerce, Kosovo Business Alliance and American Chamber of Commerce). The HCL List was endorsed by the Committee and will be submitted to the Government for approval by September 2007. The conference had a wide media coverage including the public TV station RTK.</p> <p>June 15th, a Conference on Business Community and Child Labour in Kosovo was conducted with representatives of the Centres for Social Work Kosovo wide and representatives of business community. Main challenges in terms of withdrawal and reintegration of children involved in WFCL and the role of business community in this regard were discussed by participants in this conference. The conference had a wide media coverage including public TV station KTV.</p> <p>Within the IPEC AP "Awareness raising on Worst Forms of Child Labour in Kosovo" implemented by the Management and Development Associates, it was organized a Workshop on hazards and risks of child labour in agriculture with the Trade Union of Agrocomplex (8 June 2007)</p> <p>On 8th of June a workshop with TU of Agrocomplex was organized in collaboration with Kosovo Confederation of Trade Unions. Participants in the workshop included farmers and members of TU of Agro complex. Main issues discussed include HCL in Kosovo, hazards and risks of CL in agriculture, strategies for elimination of HCL and risk assessment/management techniques.</p> <p>Within the IPEC MP for marking the WDACL in Kosovo, the televised debate show "Jeta në Kosovë"¹ (Life in Kosovo) on Child Labour was aired prime time</p>

	<p>on June 15th, in RTK public TV station and reprised the next day. The debate featured a studio debate on child labour issues in Kosovo with a panel of Kosovar institutions, civil society, experts and children. A five minute investigative field report covered actual stories and examples of hazardous child labour practices in Kosovo. Discussions focused on a/the hazards of child labour in agriculture and b/the necessity for Government and non Government interventions at legal, policy and law enforcement level to eliminate child labour in Kosovo.</p> <p>Within the same IPEC MP, a Public Service Announcement (45 seconds) produced with IPEC support is being aired several times per day starting from 6th of June by RTK public TV. The PSA includes several images of children working in hazardous activities in agriculture and the message transmitted is "Lets put an end to hazardous child labour in agriculture...together we can make it"..</p>

Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>1. Motor Run During ten-day period from June 2 - 12 branded bus with slogan "Harvest for the future: agriculture without child labour" has been running over four Oblasts (regions) of the Kyrgyz Republic visiting totally 9 provinces, the areas of cotton, tobacco, rice and other crops cultivation. In every visited locality the following actions/shows were provided to the population: -Stage play on child labour in agriculture that was performed by professional actors -Prize award for winners of the art competition which has been announced one month prior to June 12. The Run started on June 2 in Bishkek at "Dordoi" wholesale market and finished on June 12 in Nookat province (major area for tobacco cultivation) of Osh Oblast in the South. The whole run was widely aired on national and local TV and radio stations.</p> <p>2. Competition for the best photo on "Harvest for the future: agriculture without child labour". One month prior to June 12 a competition among professional photographers has been announced. All works exhibited in the Museum of Arts from June 12 - 20 and the best photos were chosen by the Board of PROACT-CAR Project. Three winners were awarded.</p> <p>3. Teasing campaign "June 12. Coming soon..." 31 picture-cards (figures) depicting children picking up cotton, threading tobacco leaves, loading cargos, selling goods, cleaning shoes placed on the central crossroads, and the busiest places (supermarkets, recreation areas, boulevards) in Bishkek, Talas, Osh and Jalalabat cities with the "June 12. Coming soon..." inscription. The "figures" were also placed in front of the main entrances of regional state administrations in Talas, Osh and Jalalabat Oblasts. The children have been sketched out and displayed from May 27 - June 15. In June 12 the inscription was changed to "June 12 - the World Day Against Child Labour". In addition, teasing campaign was covered by mass media showing short video and radio reels (20-30 seconds) on child labour with "June 12. Coming soon" inscription. The reels were on air of Piramida and 5 national TV channels. In June 12 the reels with inscription were changed accordingly.</p> <p>4. Arts competition among the children Arts competition was opened for all children below 18 years old in 9 provinces from May 10 - June 2. The children were encouraged to send either their pictures or hand made goods under "Harvest for the future: end child labour in agriculture" subject. The best works were selected and further exhibited at the Museum of Arts in Bishkek from June 12 - 20.</p>

Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>1- The CTA participated in a TV debate organized in collaboration with Lebanon's "NEW TV" on child labour on the occasion of the WDACL. Present in the debate were also representatives from Lebanon's Ministries of Labour, Education and Social Affairs, who acknowledged ILO/IPEC's leading role, technical and financial contribution with special emphasis on the importance RO Beirut gives to this issue. The TV Programme "Hada Yesma'ana" (Will somebody listen) was aired on Monday 11 June soon after the NEW TV 8 o'clock (Beirut local time) news, and included film footage from three of our IPEC collaborating centres who were visited by the NEW TV crew and accompanied by the IPEC Lebanon team for technical direction and supervision purposes.</p> <p>The 90-minute debate was held in the form of a round-table discussion during which the ILO/IPEC role was explained along with the Conventions' development and ratification and their subsequent application and supervision. Focus was then placed on the CL Conventions, leading to a discussion on the progress of the ILO/IPEC Project execution in Lebanon. The discussion also focused on specific activities in the field, with reinforcing testimonies by the three Ministries' representatives regarding collaboration with and assistance by ILO/IPEC.</p> <p>Live testimony was also provided by one of the ILO/IPEC Project's working children who had been withdrawn from work and given formal education. The child appeared on the show following consultations with our collaborating centre and with the consent of the child himself.</p> <p>On the whole, it may be safely judged that ILO/IPEC received high visibility, leading the TV moderator Ms. Delia Ahmad to plan for future follow-up programmes on CL.</p> <p>2- On 14 June 2007, the WDACL was also commemorated on Lebanon's leading "Future TV" at the 09:30 programme "A'lam Al-Sabah" (The world this morning). The 20-minute show hosted the CTA who went over ILO's mandate, IPEC and its role in combating CL with a thorough explanation of the Project activities with reference to specific interventions.</p> <p>It may also be judged the ILO/IPEC received high visibility.</p>

Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>In May 2007, IPEC Moldova contacted 13 companies-members of the local network of the Global Compact in order to provide funding for the following activities to be organized by IPEC partners all along the year 2007: a/ awareness raising activities against forced and hazardous child labour in agriculture and b/ activities within the Youth Community Centres for children withdrawn from CL in agriculture. To date, 2 digital cameras (for the territorial labour inspections) to document cases of child labour were purchased by representatives of the private sector.</p> <p>IPEC successfully advocated for mainstreaming the WFCL issues, including elements on the forced and hazardous child labour in agriculture and child labour monitoring (CLM) in the training curricula of the Social Workers. The training sessions started on 15 May 2007. By the end of 2007, a number of 900 recently recruited Social Workers from 33 areas of Moldova will benefit of 8 hours training sessions on WFCL and CLM issues. The training is funded by the Ministry of Social Protection, Family and Child and UNICEF. Sessions of WFCL and CLM issues are facilitated by two experts previously trained by IPEC and involved in implementation of IPEC programmes.</p> <p>On June 12, a Reflection Seminar on Actions Against CL in Agriculture was organized by the ILO ACTEMP project in Moldova in Chisinau. Employers federations in agriculture (previously trained by IPEC in 2006) from 15 areas of Moldova participated in the seminar. A representative of the Child Labour Unit, recently established within the State Labour Inspection, and the IPEC NPM participated as guest speakers, sharing knowledge on actions against child labour in agriculture. The Deputy Minister of Economy and Trade presented the preliminary findings of the research on the OSH aspects of hazardous CL in agriculture, carried out with the support of IPEC in 3 areas of Moldova in 2007. These findings were presented by media companies (news and thematic programmes) on the same day and beyond this date.</p> <p>The National Radio broadcasted in June interviews with the ILO National Correspondent and the IPEC NPM on the issue of child labour in Moldova. Also, the National Radio broadcasted life a radio programme on the issue of CL on June 12. The programme was facilitated by a professional journalist and two guest speakers, representing the Workers Federation in Agriculture and the Labour Inspection.</p> <p>On June 13-14, the Labour Institute, with the support of IPEC, organized a two day planning seminar for key stakeholders to ensure that 2007 harvest is free of child labour. 25 participants (multidisciplinary professionals, journalists and representatives of Workers and Employers Federations in Agriculture) agreed upon a menu of interventions to be carried out during the harvest period and beyond, to contribute to the elimination of child labour in agriculture.</p> <p>Within an IPEC MP, the National Radio and Media Center for Youth initiated in June the production of 2 radio spots and 10 radio programmes for the radio campaign ‘Children against Child Labour in Agriculture’ to be carried out throughout Moldova this year. The above radio materials will be broadcasted by</p>

	<p>the national, 15 local and 200 school radio stations in Moldova starting with July 2007. The radio programmes will include interviews with OSH experts, family and school Health Workers, Psychologists, Labour Inspectors, Teachers representing central and local public institutions and NGOs implementing actions against child labour.</p> <p>Within the IPEC MP MP "Building a Coalition among Government, Social Partners, Media and NGOs to Call for New Policy against Child Labour", a tripartite meeting of the drafting team on the Collective Convention on the Elimination of Child Labour was held on June 13 (participants: 2 representatives of the Ministry of Economy and Trade, 4 representatives of the TUs Confederation, 1 representative of Employers Confederation, IPEC). The drafting team presented the final text of the Convention to the Ministry of Economy and Trade before its submission for approval to the National Commission for Collective Bargaining.</p> <p>Two IPEC articles about the WDACL worldwide and in Moldova were published in the 6th edition of the magazine "UN in Moldova", edited by the UN Press Club in Moldova (http://www.un.md/news_room/jc/newsletters/2007/Actiunea_ONU_6_2007.pdf.)</p>

Summary of activities and outcomes	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. An official instruction of the Government of Mongolia, signed by the Prime Minister of Mongolia Mr. M. Enkhbold was sent to governors of all aimags, soums, the capital city and districts to initiate and organize effective campaigns against child labour in agriculture in their respective aimags, soums and districts throughout the year and report on measures taken and suggestions on further actions on June 2008 to the National Authority for Children. 2. ILO/IPEC provided technical assistance in organizing an annual forum of working children under a theme "Child Labour in Agriculture". The forum organized each year jointly by the National Authority for Children and the World Vision this year gathered 180 children working in agriculture and animal husbandry from all 21 aimags. The majority of children were children who herd livestock for their own families, relatives or other non-relative families. The forum enabled the participants to raise and voice the challenges faced by children herding livestock such as long working hours following livestock in hot summer, cold winter, danger of being lost, having to work at night, live far away from home for many days and being homesick, etc. At the end of the forum, the participants developed recommendations and a call for action to tackle child labour in agriculture which was presented during the consultative meeting on 12 June 2007. 3. A consultative meeting "Focusing on Child Labour in Agriculture", "Implementing National Advocacy Strategy on the Elimination of the Worst Forms of Child Labour" was held in Chinggis hotel in Ulaanbaatar on 12 June 2007. The meeting gathered around 140 representatives from ministries, governmental, non-governmental organizations, partners and international donor organizations. Rural participants included directors of agricultural department, social policy department and children's centre from all 21 aimags. The opening of the meeting was addressed the Deputy Prime Minister of Mongolia Mr. M. Enkhsaikhan and Deputy Director of ILO Office for China and Mongolia Mr. Zhang Guo-Qing. The policies of relevant ministries, namely Ministry of Social Welfare and Labour, Ministry of Education, Ministry of Food and Agriculture, view of the local governments on child labour in agriculture were presented at the meeting. One of the main outcomes of the meeting was the discussion and adoption of the action plan for 2007-2009 concerning child labour in agriculture. The three main directions of proposed activities to be implemented jointly by relevant ministries, governmental and non-governmental organizations are: improving information on children working in agriculture, improving education services for rural children, improving protection of children working in agriculture. Another key discussion evolved around the implementation of the National Advocacy Strategy on the Elimination of the Worst Forms of Child Labour, endorsed by the National Council for Children in early May this year. Social partners, non-governmental organizations and participants expressed their commitment and willingness to cooperate in the implementation of the advocacy activities and contribute to awareness raising, broad mobilization of relevant stakeholders and all concerned in combating WFCL. During the meeting, the exhibition of photos

	<p>taken by working children on their life at workplace and information displays on IPEC direct action programmes to address child labour implemented in Ulaanbaatar and five aimags was organized. The meeting was a good opportunity to raise visibility of child labour in agriculture and gain further support of relevant stakeholders nationwide in combat against child labour.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. The issue of children working in agriculture and animal husbandry was raised at the Forum of 1000 Herders, organized by the Ministry of Food and Agriculture, under the auspices of the President of Mongolia on 13-14 June 2007. The keynote report presented by the Minister for Food and Agriculture at forum raised the issue of children herding livestock for other families. Informational materials on child labour in agriculture produced by ILO/IPEC were distributed to all participants of the forum. 5. All implementing agencies of IPEC action programmes organized various awareness raising activities at their project sites in Ulaanbaatar, such as TV programmes, open days, production and dissemination of informational materials, meetings, workshops to disseminate information on child labour in agriculture. 6. All the events of WDACL received significant coverage in print, broadcast and online media. The TV channels, such as Mongolian National Public Television, Channel 25, TV5, UVS, TV9, TM, SBN, C1, NTV had covered the event in their prime-time news editions. A documentary on child labour in agriculture "Children Herding Livestock" was made and broadcast on Mongolian National Public Television on 12 June 2007, also TV and radio spots were developed and broadcast on major TV and radio channels. In addition, informational materials, such as translated into Mongolian brochure on CL in agriculture "Harvest for the future: Agriculture without child labour", a notebook with the cover focusing on CL in agriculture, a briefing paper on "WDACL 2007: Focusing on child labour in agriculture", a fact sheet about IPEC Mongolia activities focusing on child labour in agriculture were developed, printed and disseminated.

Harvest for the Future: **Agriculture without child labour**

Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>The ILO Office for Pakistan, jointly with the government, employers' and workers' organization and social partners observed the World Day Against Child Labour in 22 districts across the country. All IPEC projects made designed special programmes to highlight the theme for this year's Word Day Against Child Labour (WDACL) - elimination of child labour in agriculture, especially the worst forms.</p> <p>Image of front page of the special supplement with messages from President and Prime Minister of Pakistan. The supplement also carried the messages of the Minister of Labour, Minister of Information, General Secretary, Pakistan Workers Federation, and Acting President, Employers Federation of Pakistan and Direct ILO Office for Pakistan</p> <p>Under the Media Project, a special four page supplement was organized. For the first time, the President and Prime Minister of Pakistan sent their messages to commemorate the WDACL. The supplement also carried the messages of the Minister of Labour, Minister of Information, General Secretary, Pakistan Workers Federation, and Acting President, Employers Federation of Pakistan and Direct ILO Office for Pakistan. The supplement was published in Urdu and English languages by Jang Group of Publications – having largest circulation newspapers, Daily Jang,</p>

and The News daily. Moreover, the Media Project also organized discussion programmes to commemorate on WDACL 2007 on the state run national television and radio networks, PBC and PTV. IPEC staff in Pakistan contributed to these initiatives.

Private English language TV Channel, DAWN TV, also interviewed Mr. Donglin Li Director, ILO Office for Pakistan, on the even of WDACL 2007. Moreover, the main avenue leading to the national Assembly (where the budget session was in progress) was filled with streamers carrying messages against child labour in agriculture and general. Big Banners carrying similar messages were also displayed on all major crossings and key junctions in Islamabad.

WDACL 2007 in Islamabad

The Minister of State for Education, Madam Anisazeb Tahirkheli was the chief guest at the main event of WDACL 2007 held in Islamabad at the ILO Auditorium. Senior government officials from various ministries, representatives of workers and employers organizations, UN agencies, foreign missions, and more that 200 children (from ILO's rag-picking project) took part in the main event.

Children from TBP Project (Rag-picker Component) made three stage performances highlighting the challenges and despair of child labourers in the agriculture and deep sea fishing sectors. They excellently depicted the emotions and haplessness of their families who have to face hardship of life. One girl performer, playing the role of female farmer, epitomized the feelings of families with children in the agricultural labour while passionately demanding action for their welfare. The guests were fully engrossed in all the performances. A multimedia animated presentation, with flute instrumental, depicting images and facts on child labour was also presented.

The Minister appreciated ILO's efforts to highlight the issue of child labour and its efforts to rehabilitate them through the provision of free education, literacy and skills training. She also informed that the Ministry of Education with ILO's technical assistance is mainstreaming the educational needs of child labour into the upcoming National Educational Policy 2007. She said that this will help to initiate large scale programme to offer free education to rehabilitate child labourers.

Mr. Donglin Li, Director, ILO office for Pakistan welcomed the guests and children. He said that similar to the worldwide trend, in Pakistan too agriculture is the sector where by far the largest share of working children is found — nearly 67 percent. Over 2.2 million girls and boys, aged 5 to 14 years old, work in various hazardous activities in the agriculture. Mr. Li also informed that presently around 50,000 children are benefiting from ILO's International Programme on the Elimination of Child Labour (IPEC) led various projects. Mr. Saifullah Chaudhry, Senior Programme Officer, ILO-IPEC, presented key policy and community level key

interventions under various IPEC Projects. He particularly highlighted the need to mainstream child labour rehabilitation programme into the national development policy and programmes specially related to education and social protection. Mr. Haji Javed representing Employer Federation of Pakistan, said that EFP is committed create more awareness on combating child labour and Occupational Safety and Health issues. He said that EFP is partner to ILO's Decent Work Country Programme and it supports all child labour related programmes run by ILO and the government.

Brigadier (r) M. Sarfraz, Director General, Pakistan Bait-ul-Maal (PBM), while speaking on the occasion informed that his organisation has now resources to offer support to the families of all 50,000 child labourers receiving free education under the ILO-IPEC's ongoing programmes in Pakistan. Mr. Mohammad Athar, Central Labour Adviser, Ministry of Labour, expressed the support of the Ministry to move further on child labour laws and to provide all support to ILO for the implementation of child labour programmes.



Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>Media briefing – 12 June (with press reports running until 15 June)</p> <p>A media briefing was held in a form of round table discussion on children working on farms on World Day Against Child Labour.</p> <p>The event took place at the Constitution Hill, Johannesburg. The venue was selected because the complex includes the Constitutional Court and is associated with human rights including children's rights.</p> <p>The main objective of the event was to give journalists and the public at large (through the media coverage) insight into the local relevance of the 2007 international theme "Harvesting for the Future: Agriculture without child labour" and why the specific focus on child labour in agriculture.</p> <p>This was complemented by a study commissioned by programme Towards the Elimination of the worst forms of Child Labour (TECL), the IPEC programme assisting South Africa with the implementation of its national Child Labour Programme of Action. The study was undertaken by the Human Science Research Council (HSRC) "Qualitative research on child labour in commercial and subsistence agriculture" and there was input from other organisations/stakeholders in the agricultural field and also the South African Department of Labour (DOL) on the Basic Conditions of Employment.</p> <p>Outcomes of the briefing:</p> <p>There was good media coverage of the World Day Against Child Labour, despite a massive national strike of public servants in all sectors, which dominated the news.</p> <p>Media coverage included many radio interviews, TV interviews and newspaper articles. The coverage fits into relatively extensive and continuous media coverage on child labour in general in South Africa.</p> <p>The event earned a total media coverage of R 1 406 613 (USD 200 945) on straight Advertising Value Equivalent rate (AVE). Total media coverage on the PR value would have been R4 219 839 (USD 602 834). This is calculated on the principle of multiplying the advertising value by three, based on the findings of studies showing that members of the public believe news and current affairs items three times more, compared to advertising.</p> <p>Of all the coverage, radio accounted for 90%, with the remainder being TV and print media.</p>

Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>Key Activities: Thailand observed the World Day against Child Labour on 12 June 2007. The event organized at the centre of business district in Bangkok, the Central World, where the event attracted a numbers of general public. There were approximately 600 people attend the event: 350 students from rural and Bangkok areas, 170 adults and 17 media were registered, and approximately 70-80 walk-in participants. The event was highlighted with the keynote addressed by the Minister of Labour and ceremony of solidarity to eliminate the worst forms of child labour in agriculture and in Thailand, releasing of "Balloons of Freedom: Green Agriculture without Child Labour" along with children and honourable guests.</p> <p>All activities focused on mechanism to prevent and protect children from working in hazardous environment within the legal framework of the Ministry of Labour and promote safe working conditions for youth. Since Thailand has been promoting green, chemical free agricultural products for more than a decade, the campaign will link some of these positive practices to promote safe working environment for youth engaged in agricultural activities. Youth participation in family farm activities can help youngsters learn valuable skills and contribute to household income. Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>As IPEC has a wide range of activities throughout Turkey in combating child labour, there are total number of 13 provinces (Ankara, İstanbul, İzmir, Bursa, Kocaeli, Gaziantep, Diyarbakır, Şanlıurfa, Batman, Mersin, Adana, Çorum, Antalya,) where USDOL funded IPEC projects are being implemented.</p> <p>With regard to the 2007 WDACL, there was organized half day awareness raising meetings focusing on “Elimination of Child Labour in Agriculture” in each province. During the meetings a session is devoted to the findings of recent “Child Labour Survey” which shows again a significant decrease in number of child labourers in Turkey. Local level project based activities and outputs that are achieved to date were also presented in each province</p> <p>Following the meetings marches have been organized to the city centres by mid-day with the participation of children, families and representatives of various institutions. During the marches posters and banners were carried by the participants, hats, flyers and brochures were distributed to the public and press announcements have been made by the children or the organizing committee representatives. This was followed by week long activities (concerts, folk dances, painting exhibitions, sports activities, free cinema, theatre, museum and fun fair entrances to the targeted children at local levels etc.).</p> <p>A decision has been made in all the provincial action committees to celebrate 12 June each year (minutes sent to the General Directorate of Social Services and Child Protection Agency (SHCEK) and Ministry of Labour and Social Security (MOLSS) by the Committees to organize the event nationally in 81 provinces) which was resulted with a principal agreement of MOLSS and SHCEK to organize 2008 WDACL jointly in entire Turkey.</p> <p>Media gave great importance to the events; local and national newspapers published the activities, IPEC HQ and field personnel participated in local and national TV and radio broadcasts. Furthermore French TV Channel TF1 broadcasted daily cycle of seasonal agriculture workers in Turkey on the occasion of WDACL (originally broadcasted at Journal 20h of TF1, on June 12, 2007) and the intervention modalities within the framework of an ongoing IPEC AP: "Integrated Programme for the Elimination of WFCL in seasonal commercial agriculture" implemented by Ministry of National Education. The referred broadcast was involved interviewing families, employers, intermediaries, children, teachers and our project personnel and understanding the AP interventions in directing children to education. Summary of activities and outcomes	<p>On June 8th, 2007, ILO-IPEC Ukraine in collaboration with the ILO National Correspondent organized a press-conference “Harvest for the Future: Agriculture Without Child Labour” at the National Information Center UKRINFORM, in Kyiv. The speakers were the ILO National Correspondent, ILO-IPEC National Programme Manager, Ministry of Labour and Social Policy (Labour Inspection), State Department on Industrial Safety, Occupational Safety and Health and Mining Supervision (OSH Inspection), Trade Union of Workers in Agricultural Complex (TUACW – affiliated to the IUF) and the specialized national child medical centre OHMATDIT (Unit of Reconstructive Surgery).</p> <p>ILO representatives informed that child labour is mostly used in agriculture (globally around – 70%; in Ukraine – 46%). The OSH Inspection representative informed that one child died and about 15-16 children were injured during the harvest time in 2006, in Ukraine. The OSH Inspection, as well as Labour Inspection, reported on the current actions undertaken by the state regarding inspection and control of the workplaces where children work and on measures to protect children. In order to inform on the risks of child labour in agriculture, the representatives of the medical centre OHMATDIT showed a PPT on the consequences of child labour, in particular traumas and injuries children got while working in agriculture. The representatives of the TUACW reported on the practical steps taken by their organization to prevent child labour (mainstreaming child labour in the Collective Agreement; providing counselling for parents of working children).</p> <p>The journalists were informed on the planned new partnership of the international agricultural agencies to eliminate child labour in agriculture and the key messages developed jointly by the ILO, FAO, IFAD, IFPRI/CGIAR, IFAP and the IUF on laws on child labour in agriculture: 1) enforcement of the laws on child labour in agriculture, especially to ensure that children do not carry out hazardous work in agriculture, 2) improvement of the living standards in rural areas and mainstreaming child labour into the national agricultural policies and programmes, 3) reduction of the urban-rural and gender gap in education, and 4) promotion of youth employment opportunities in agriculture and rural areas.</p> <p><u>Media coverage:</u> 5 radio news programmes (including BBC); 4 TV news on child labour during the prime-time (19:30 – 21:30); 19 articles on the online publications; 6 articles/reports in the newspapers and magazines.</p> <p>On June 11 2007, the Donetsk TV channel broadcasted a 1.5 hours live talk show on child labour, WDACL and child labour in agriculture. Shots from the IPEC video on child labour, as well as the PSA on risks and hazards of child labour were used during the TV programme. The PSA was shown in prime-time and had an approximately 2.5 millions audience.</p> <p>On June 12th, 2007, the All-Ukrainian Coalition of the NGOs “Unite for Children” in collaboration with the Social Services for Youth, Children and Families, Kyiv Municipality, State Labour Inspection of Ukraine (Ministry of Labour and Social Policy), Ministry of Education and Science and ILO-IPEC organized SCREAM-based street activities dedicated to the WDACL 2007. 105 children from rural areas in Kyiv region, 50 parents and passers-by participated in the event held in the Central Park of Kyiv city. During the opening ceremony, the Child Labour Unit (State Labour Inspection, MLSP) informed children on the legal employment age (minimum age), their rights, child labour and the role of education for</p>

	<p>the child future. Afterwards, children released balloons – symbols of their hopes for a decent future, thus voting for a future without child labour. Young volunteers carried out thematic SCREAM-based activities to inform children on the risks and hazards in agriculture. All participants were provided with the WDACL promotional materials, i.e. leaflets and bookmarks, as well as with IPEC postcards and posters.</p> <p><u>Media coverage:</u> 3 radio programmes; 4 articles in newspapers and magazines; 1 national TV programme in prime-time.</p> <p>On June 12th, 2007, the International Women's Rights Protection Centre "LaStrada-Ukraine" in collaboration with the Ministry of Interior organized a thematic discussion with children from the juvenile centre in Kyiv. The subject of the discussions was the risks and hazards of child labour, children's own experience related to child labour, the value of education for the children's future. Children received brochures, booklets and bookmarks printed under the Trafficking project - Phase 1, as well as sets of stationery including drawing albums, pens, paints, etc.</p> <p>On June 12th, 2007, the NGO Donetsk Youth Debate Centre in collaboration with the Khartcyzsk Department on Juvenile Affairs and Youth Council (an executive committee with the local state administration) organized an open air graffiti drawing show for the local children and community (Khartcyzsk, Donetsk region). The "graffiti" was held in the central park of the city. Children from vulnerable families drew thematic graffiti on the park wall and put their hands, covered with special paint, thus voting against child labour. All of them, as well as hundreds of passers-by were provided with awareness raising materials on child labour in agriculture, booklets and brochures on child labour. The event was supported by the Head of the Khartcyzsk Department on Minors' Affairs.</p> <p><u>Media coverage:</u> 2 articles in the local newspaper.</p> <p>On June 12th, 2007, the IPEC partner in Kherson region - NGO Successful Woman - organized three interactive discussions on child labour in agriculture with 54 children in the local summer camp. About 260 children from the summer camp were provided with IPEC bookmarks produced under the Trafficking project - Phase 1, while their teachers received booklets on child labour in agriculture "Harvest for the future: agriculture without child labour".</p> <p><u>Media coverage:</u> A special radio programme was prepared and broadcasted 6 times on the regional radio station "Tariya", covering an audience of 500 people.</p>
