- Occupational Safety & Health Knowledge Survey of Incoming University Students. (This

- Attitude of Employers and Older Nurses to Prolonged Working Life in the Nursing Profession in Western Australia.

The following research projects are being conducted.

- Cover violence in nursing A Western Australian experience.
- Occupational Respiratory Health Surveillance at Murin Murrin Mine Site.
- Investigating the excretion pattern of diesel exhaust metabolites in urine to quantify workplace diesel engine exhaust exposure.

- Prevention of Long Duration Workers' Compensation Claims Pre-Claim Intervention and Strategy.
- International transportability of occupational safety & health credentials.
- Evaluating the effectiveness of traditional classroom 2D/3D multimedia and virtual reality delivery methods for gas pipeline safety training.

Peer Mentoring and Work Experience

In conjunction with Members of the Safety Institute of Australia, Western Australian Division, we are providing peer mentoring and work experience for university students that are studying to become occupational safety practitioners. In this partnership the learning is two ways. The students learn about what really happens in the workplace and are given practical work experience. The Safety Professionals who are providing the peer mentoring and/or the work experience are kept up to date with the latest developments in their profession through the learning activities and research work of these students.
