Failure to supply reports for the past five years on unratified Conventions and Recommendations

The Government has provided the following written information.

The Government of Uganda acknowledges its reporting obligations to the ILO and appreciates the work done by the Committee on the Application of Standards and the Committee of Experts.

As part of the efforts to ensure full compliance with its reporting obligations, the Government consults extensively with numerous stakeholders, including social partners, during the process of preparing reports for submission to the ILO.

Due to new Government's regulations concerning reporting to international bodies, additional time is required to provide the requisite responses. In this regard, the Ministry of Gender, Labour and Social Development is conducting the final stages of stakeholder consultations with a view of providing a comprehensive response to both individual cases and reports on non-ratified conventions in accordance with Article 19 of the ILO Constitution.

These reports will be submitted to the ILO by 30 September 2024.

Uganda is committed to working closely with the ILO to ensure the timely and accurate fulfilment of its responsibilities. We welcome any capacity-building support regarding our obligations, especially under Article 19 of the ILO Constitution.
