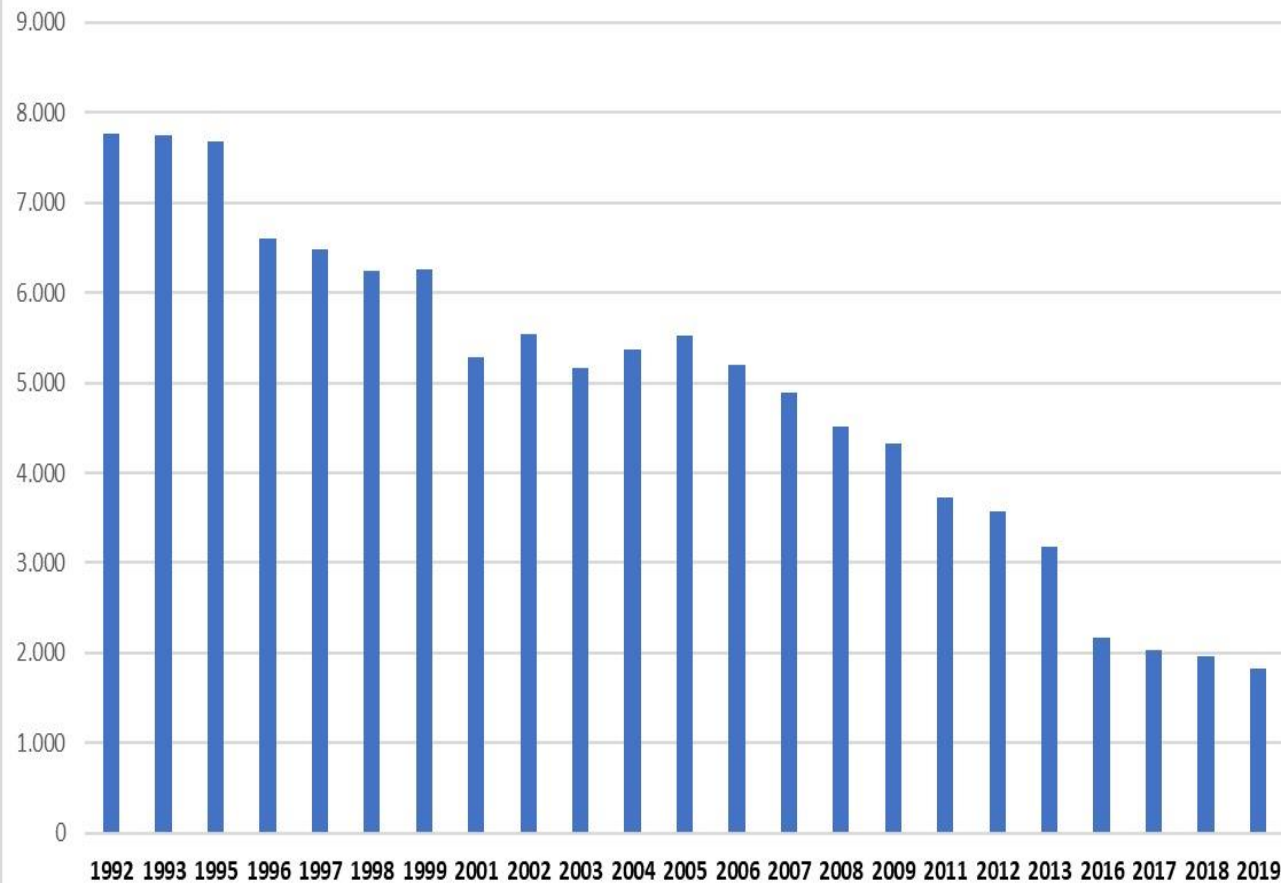

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Child labor: overview and evolution in Brazil

Evolution of the number of children and adolescents aged 5 to 17 in child labor.



No. of children and adolescents aged 5 to 17 in child labor

1992 – 7,8 million

2019 – 1,8 million

(706 thousand in the Worst Forms of Child Labor)

Result: a 77% reduction in the number of children and adolescents in child labor.

Child and adolescent occupancy rate

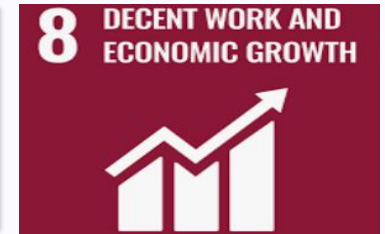
1992 – 23,6%

2019 – 4,6%

Result: 80% reduction in the percentage of children and adolescents in child labor.

The role of the Labor Inspectorate in combating child labor

Sustainable Development Goals (SDG 8) - 8.7. - take immediate and effective measures to (...) ensure the prohibition and elimination of the worst forms of child labor, (...), and by 2025 end child labor in all its forms.



National Plan for the Prevention and Eradication of Child Labor - Intensify child labor inspection actions (priority for the worst forms of child labor); Increase the number of Labor Inspectors (AFT) assigned to combat child labor.



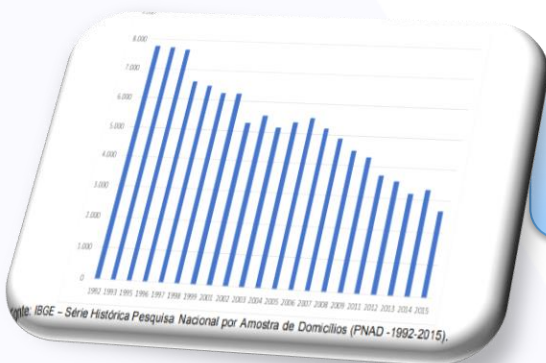
ILO International Conventions 138, 182, 81 and 129; Convention on the Rights of the Child; Guidelines on General Principles of Labour Inspection; Durban Call to Action on the Elimination of Child Labour: 19 - improve the effective enforcement of national laws, regulations and policies on child labour by strengthening the capacity of labour inspectorates.



National Legislation: Federal Constitution; Consolidation of Labor Laws; List of the Worst Forms of Child Labor (Decree No. 6.481/2008); Labor Inspection Regulations (Decree No. 4.552/2002); Statute of the Child and Adolescent.



Objectives of labor inspection in the fight against child labor



Reducing the number of child laborers in Brazil, contributing to the achievement of target 8.7 of the Sustainable Development Goals.

Enforcing the rules establishing the minimum age for work and the prohibition of harmful work for adolescents.



Promoting the Fundamental Rights of Children and Adolescents in Child Labor Situations.

- ❑ 10,000 Children and adolescents removed from child labor;
- ❑ 8,000 Inspection actions that found child labor.

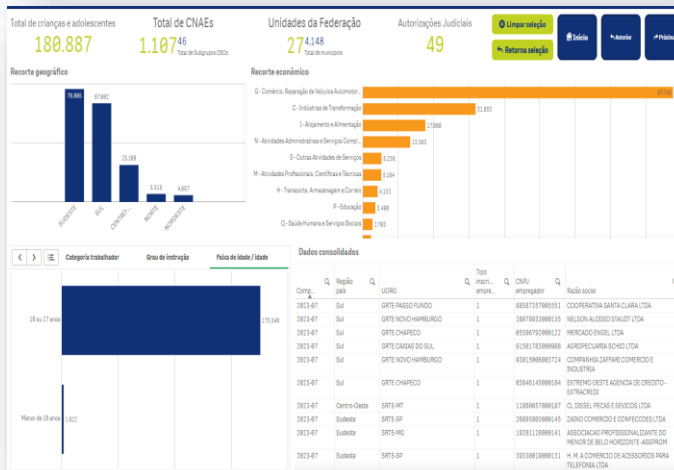
PERFORMANCE INDICATORS

- ❑ Percentage of children and adolescents removed from the Worst Forms of IT;
- ❑ Percentage of actions that found children and adolescents in child labor situations.

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Evidence-based planning: Subsidies for inspection planning



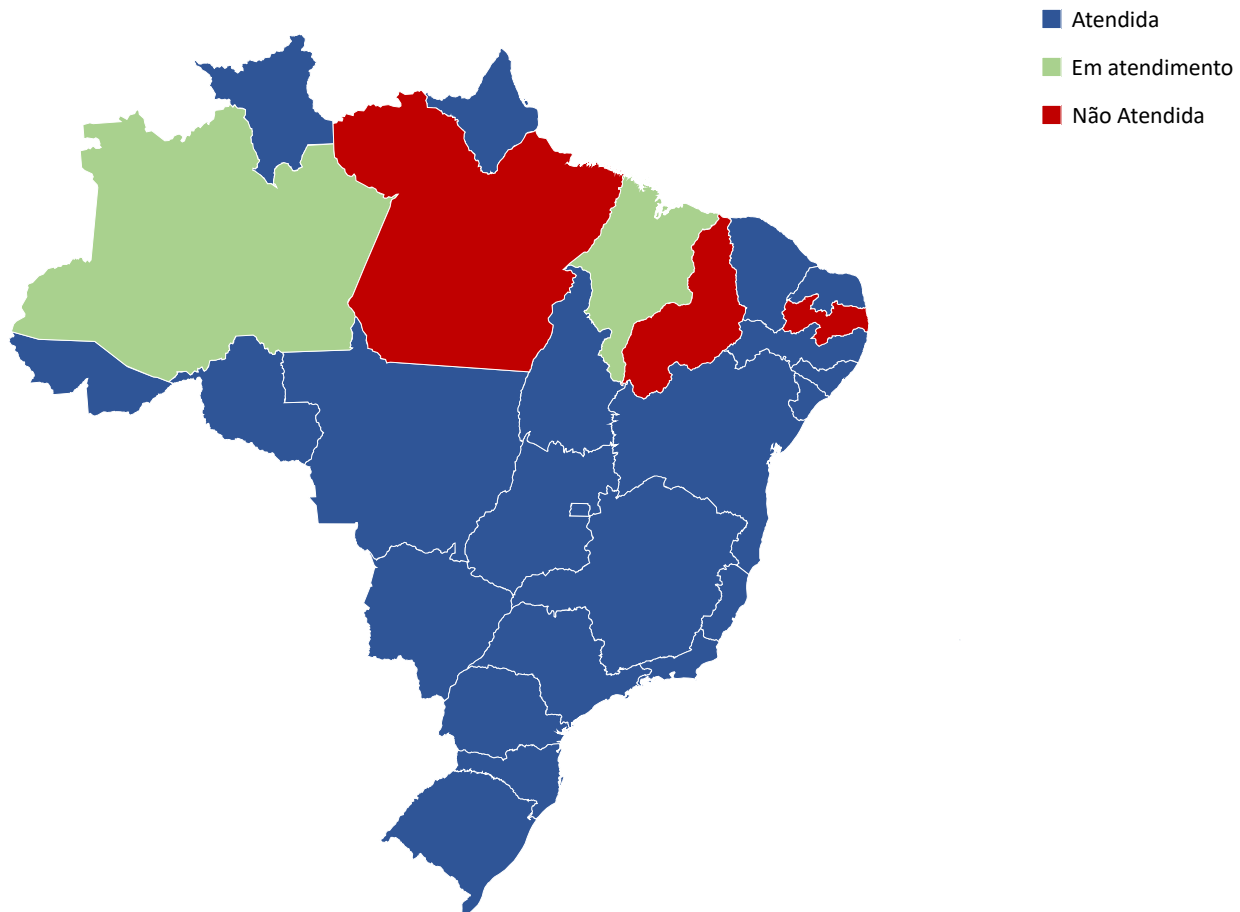
Technical and operational resources

- Internet reporting channel: Ipê Child Labor System;
- Child labor evidence system: Qlik Child Labor Panel;
- Diagnosis of child labor hotspots by state;
- Articulation and demands from other public and private bodies and entities.



Monitoring and evaluation: results of targets

Target 2022 - result of Regional Units



Da plataforma Bing
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22 states met or exceeded the stipulated target, a result 47% higher than in 2021.

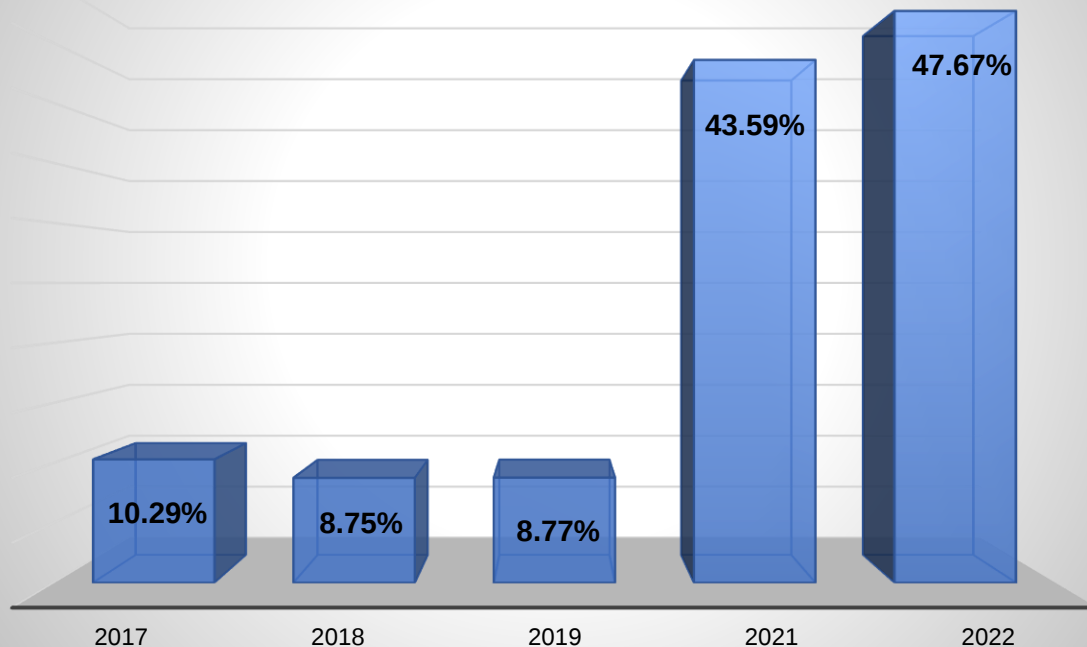
17 states met more than 100% of the target.

Only **3 states** failed to meet the target set for the year.

Monitoring and evaluation of performance indicators

Indicator: "**Percentage of actions with findings of children and adolescents in child labor situations**".

Hit rate of inspections to combat child labor



Importance of the Indicator: the improvement in the hit rate results in greater efficiency and effectiveness in tax actions to combat child labor, contributing directly to the results for the purposes of meeting the target, as well as increasing the social impact of the actions.
