Second report: Closure of the representation alleging non-observance by Chile of the MLC, 2006, and Convention No. 187, pursuant to a successful conciliation process

1. By means of an electronic form received on 20 November 2023, the National Federation of Unions of Officers of Merchant and Special Vessels of Chile (FENASIOMECHI) and the Federation of Maritime and Seafarers' Unions (FESIMAR) made a representation to the International Labour Office under article 24 of the ILO Constitution, alleging non-observance by Chile of the Maritime Labour Convention, 2006, as amended (MLC, 2006), and the Promotional Framework for Occupational Safety and Health Convention, 2006 (No. 187). The parties expressed their willingness to participate in a voluntary conciliation procedure at the national level. At its 351st Session (June 2024), the Governing Body, in the light of the information contained in document GB.351/INS/12/1, and taking into consideration the recommendation of its Officers as well as the agreement expressed by the parties to participate in a voluntary conciliation process, decided that the representation was receivable and to set up a tripartite committee to examine it.
2. As a result of the voluntary conciliation process, on 14 May 2025, the parties to the representation signed an agreement at the ILO Country Office for the South Cone of Latin America, in which they indicated their willingness to no longer pursue the representation procedure.

The Governing Body, noting that an agreement had been reached between the parties concerned following a conciliation process, and on the recommendation of its Officers, decided to close the procedure of the representation alleging non-observance by Chile of the Maritime Labour Convention, 2006, as amended (MLC, 2006), and the Promotional Framework for Occupational Safety and Health Convention, 2006 (No. 187).
