The Government has provided the following written information.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation of the Democratic Republic of Timor-Leste has the honour to reiterate the Government's commitment to fulfilling its obligations under the ILO framework, while acknowledging that timely reporting and submission of ILO instruments are essential. Timor-Leste underscores its ongoing efforts to strengthen capacity and coordination among line ministries and other stakeholders to meet ILO standards.

Furthermore, the Secretary of State for Vocational Training and Employment (SEFOPE) of Timor-Leste has requested technical assistance from the ILO Decent Work Technical Support Team in Bangkok. Mr Jajoon Coue, the ILO International Labour Standards Specialist, will provide targeted training for SEFOPE and other relevant government officials on ILO reporting obligations and will work on a practical road map to address the backlog of reporting related to unratified Conventions and their implementation.

The Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the International Labour Standards Department (NORMES) the assurance of its highest consideration.
