The event is organized in conjunction with the www.ilo.org/safeyouth towards the XXI World Congress on Safety and Health at Work.

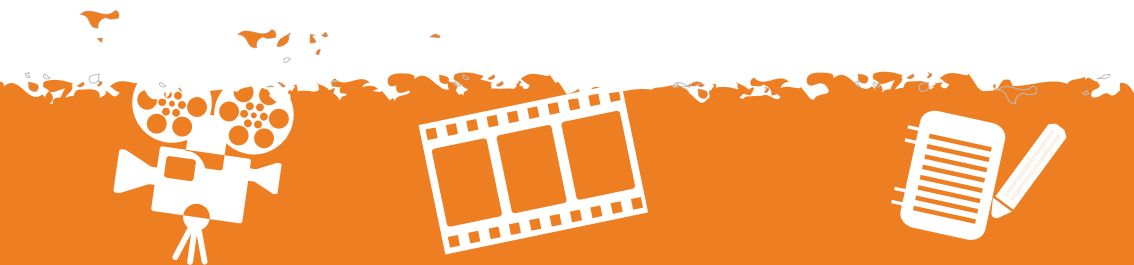
WHY SAFER WORK FOR YOUTH?

Do you know that young workers – aged between 15 and 24, suffer up to 40% higher rate of injury than older workers due to a lack of awareness of safety rules and rights, training and experience?

The fact is primarily why we want to explore young people's perspective of safety and health at work. We want to see and hear about the untold stories that young people face or witness related to work dangers. We want to listen to your experience and help you in spreading how the society can embark on a path towards better working conditions for young people.

This year, the competition is about how young people perceive a workplace as safe and healthy to themselves and their communities, and in what ways they wish to reduce the number of workplace accidents and work-related fatal diseases for the community in the future.

The competition is open to all Vietnamese citizens aged 15 to 24. For more information, please see our Terms of Participation.



WHAT'S IN THE PRIZE?

THE CHANCE TO SINGAPORE FOR THE XXI WORLD CONGRESS ON SAFETY AND HEALTH AT WORK!

A portable speaker for public speaking and outdoor activities? Or a portable drive/USB for carry-on data? They're all in our prizes!

In addition, winners at both categories will receive a Certificate of Recognition from the ILO Viet Nam. Winning submissions will be included on the *ILO Viet Nam Facebook*.

What's more? The chance to speak at the XXI World Congress on Safety and Health at Work in Singapore!

Winning entries under the age category between 18 – 24 years old will be supported to be uploaded to the www.ilo.org/safeyouth/en. If selected, the submission contributors will become a member of the Youth Champion participating in the *XXI World Congress on Safety and Health at Work taking place in Singapore from 3-6 September 2017*. All expenses incurred from travel, accommodations and relevant costs will be covered by the ILO and the organizer of the Congress. Winning submissions will be presented at an awards ceremony before an international audience of some 4,000 participants.

TERMS OF PARTICIPATION

The entry into the competition constitutes a binding acceptance of the following terms and conditions:

1. ENTRY CRITERIA

- 1.1 The Competition commences on 01 May 2017 at 12am GMT+7 and concludes on 24 June 2017 at 11:59pm GMT+7. The ILO Viet Nam reserves the right to extend the duration and closing date of the Competition - or to cancel the Competition, or either of the two categories, if an insufficient number of quality entries are received.



- 1.2 Participants must hold a Vietnamese citizenship/passport and be at least 15 years old and not older than 24 years old at the time of participation. Entries submitted will be categorized into age group: from 15 to 17, and from 18 to 24.
- 1.3 Entry into the competition by participants under 18 years old must obtain a prior permission from their parents and/or legal guardians in writing.
- 1.4 To enter the Competition, participants shall upload their work on Facebook page of the ILO Viet Nam. Only entries uploaded successfully and displayed as "public" on the page shall be considered eligible for subsequent review.
- 1.5 All entries must be original work and be produced after 1 January 2016.
- 1.6 Entries shall be judged and voted on individual account. No group work shall be accepted and the award of prizes shall be made upon individual basis – herein the holder of the uploading Facebook account.
- 1.7 There is no limit to the number of entries that may be submitted by one participant.
- 1.8 It is advisable that submissions enclose the message [Bạn sẽ giúp mang lại môi trường làm việc an toàn hơn cho thanh niên bằng cách tham gia cuộc thi truyền thông An toàn cho lao động trẻ! #Antoancholaodongtre #SafeYouth@Work] (the message: "Be part of the change to help make young people safe at work!" and hashtag: #Antoancholaodongtre #SafeYouth@Work). Submissions must be presented in the following order:

- 1.9 Submissions may consist of films, photographs, posters/drawings, songs, stories, or other materials addressing the criteria in 3.2.
- 1.10 Submissions shall not show brand names, recognizable places of business or other subjects that are identifiable as the brand or product of a specific entity. Submissions shall not feature misleading or offensive content.



- 1.11 A submission may be in either Vietnamese or English. For a submission in Vietnamese, it is encouraged that an English subtitle be enclosed. The English subtitle must be faithful to the original meaning in Vietnamese. The English translation will be the one judged once the submission is screened in the Global SafeYouth@Work Media Competition.
- 1.12 Participants accept the obligation to bear any and all costs associated with the submission.
- 1.13 The participation in the Competition is free-of-charge.

2. PRIZES

- 2.1 Prizes will be awarded in two schemes: the Judges' Awards and Public Awards. Winning participants will be notified of the results and procedures regarding the awarding of the prizes by means of contact details provided to the ILO Viet Nam.
- 2.2 Selection process:
 - Each week, there will be 5 Judges' Awards and 5 Public Awards presented to valid entries submitted in accordance with the terms and conditions.
 - The Judges' Awards shall be determined by a judging panel after a review process of qualifying entries, in which the overall quality of the submission will be weighed in reference to the presented criteria. Among five weekly awards by the judges, there will be 1 Judge's Choice of the Week and 4 Judge's Nominations of the Week. The results will be announced by 10:00am on Wednesday of the week after.
 - The Public Awards shall be determined by the count of Facebook votes. 1 entry of the most votes will be awarded as Public Choice of the Week, while four adjacent entries will be awarded as Public Nomination of the Week. Voting will continue and count until the specified closing time. Weekly voting closes at 11:59 pm GMT+7 every Saturday. Voting results will be announced by 10:00am on Wednesday of the week after.
 - Two final grand prizes will be presented to two entries under their respective schemes as "Commitment to Safety" Awards. The results will be announced on 30 June 2017 at 11:30am GMT+7.



- Prize structures are as follow:

- Weekly Judges' Awards: A portable drive – model HDD WD Passport Ultra 1TB/USB 3.0/2'5" will be awarded to the Judges' Choice of the Week and four 16 GB Flash Drive USBs will be awarded to 4 other Judges' Nominations of the Week.



- Weekly Public Awards: A portable drive - model HDD WD Passport Ultra 1TB/USB 3.0/2'5" will be awarded to the Public Choice of the Week – which constitutes the entry that receives highest count of Facebook votes. Four 16 GB Flash Drive USBs will be awarded to 4 other Public Nominations of the Week.

- "Commitment-to-Safety" Awards – Final Grand Prize: A JBL Charge 3 Speaker to each of the two entries voted and selected under two respective schemes.



- 2.3 There is no restriction applied in award concurrence. An entry may be considered for both award schemes, while weekly winners remain eligible to be considered for the Grand Prize.
- 2.4 All winners will be instructed and supported to upload their winning submissions to the Global SafeYouth@Work Media Competition page. The uploading of such entries bears the possibility to become a Youth Champion and the chance to the XXI World Congress on Safety and Health at Work in Singapore for the contributor. - 2.5 All winning submissions will be featured on ILO Viet Nam Facebook page.
- 2.6 All winners will receive an award certificate from the ILO Viet Nam.

3. JUDGMENT CRITERIA

- 3.1 The ILO Viet Nam will conduct a preliminary review and evaluation of qualifying entries. Top entries in each of the 2 age categories will be made available on ILO Viet Nam Facebook page under two aforementioned award schemes.



The decision of the ILO Viet Nam on all matters relating to the Competition is final, and no correspondence or appeal will be entered into at any stage.

3.2 Submissions must clearly articulate the contributors' ideas of safety and health in the workplace, and/or the importance of building a preventive culture of safety and health within the setting. Submissions should address at least one of the following criteria:

- Motivation or instructions to increase or emphasize safety in the work place for young people.
- Focusing attention on or creating awareness of the importance of recognizing hazards in the workplace.
- Improving company organization, communication and/or commitment to workplace safety for young persons.
- The importance of young workers becoming actively engaged in raising awareness of workplace safety issues and/or in securing their legal right to a safe and healthy workplace.

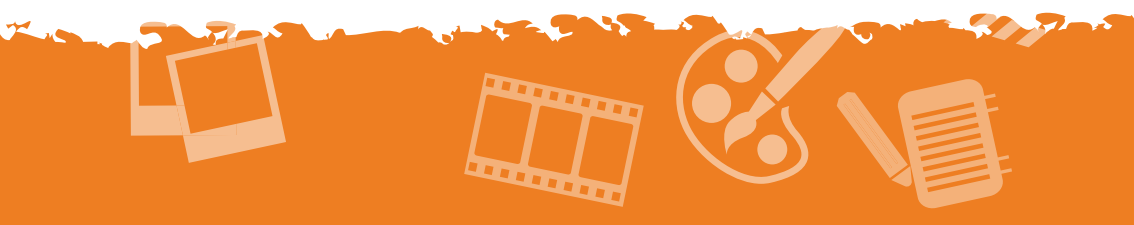
3.3 Submissions will be judged on the following criteria:

- Creativity: the uses of innovative, original thinking and techniques to tell a story.
- Effectiveness: a well-articulated message conveyed through the work to promote the importance of preventive measures for youth safety and health at work.

4. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY

4.1 All intellectual property rights in the submission will remain vested in the participants.

4.2 The participants hereby grant the ILO a non-exclusive, worldwide, permanent, irrevocable and royalty-free license to use, reproduce, publish, adapt, distribute, and otherwise disseminate any entries submitted under this Competition in connection with the ILO's mandate. Such license shall include the right to grant sublicenses, including to the organizers of the World Congress referred herein.



- 4.3 The participant declares that any intellectual property or material involved in the submission (e.g., image, footage, lyrics, sound effect) created by him/her or that he/she received permission to use them in his/her submission, and that the submission may be used by the ILO as provided for in these Terms of Participation.
- 4.4 The participant declares that he/she has directly received valid consent from the subject(s) whom voice, image or likeness is used in the submission. Where the participant is using any intellectual property or material created by a third party in accordance with the preceding paragraph, the participant declares that he/she has received written confirmation from that third party that such valid consent has been received. In all cases, where the subject(s) whom voice, image or likeness is used in the submission do not have the capacity to consent on their own, the participant declares that this permission has been given by an authorized person (e.g., parents or legal guardians of the subject(s)) and is valid in accordance with applicable laws.
- 4.5 Where the ILO publishes any of the submissions, the ILO will endeavour to ensure that the name of the participant appears in the following manner: ILO/Name of the participant.
- 4.6 If requested by the ILO, the participant will provide the original support of the submission in high resolution.

5. RESPECT OF LEGISLATION

- 5.1 Participants warrant that they have abided by any applicable laws in the creation and submission of the entries.

6. SETTLEMENT OF DISPUTES

- 6.1 Upon any dispute or controversy arising out of these terms and conditions, the participants and the ILO are expected to make every effort to resolve amicably by direct informal negotiations, failing which the matter will be finally settled by arbitration in accordance with the UNCITRAL Arbitration Rules as at present in force. The arbitral tribunal shall consist of a sole arbitrator.
- 6.2 Nothing in or relating to these Terms of Participation or the Competition will be deemed a waiver of any of the privileges and immunities of the ILO.
