Project context

Phase 2 of the 'Applying the G20 Training Strategy: A Partnership of the ILO and the Russian Federation' Project represents a continued response by the Russian Federation and the International Labour Organization (ILO) to support the application of the G20 Training Strategy. The major focus of the Project is training relevant national staff to critically analyze and improve national and sectoral skills development systems in beneficiary countries as well as to reform and develop these systems with Project support.

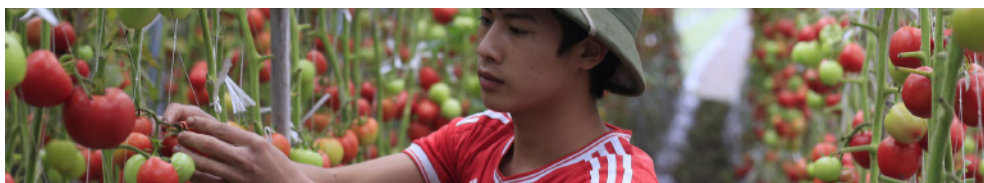
The Project contributes to the Decent Work Country Programme for Viet Nam, addressing the following areas:

- Improvement of sectoral TVET governance systems involving Sector Skills Councils and/or equivalent industry bodies and knowledge development of key stakeholders, especially in the Agriculture and the Tourism and Hospitality sectors;
- Capacity building on developing qualification systems, occupational standards, and assessment instruments and their alignment with ASEAN principles;
- Knowledge and skills development for production of competency-based training (CBT) programmes and its alignment with relevant regional practices;
- Development and piloting of occupational standards, qualifications, training programmes and assessment instruments in the Tourism and Hospitality sector for priority occupations;
- Capacity building for establishment of public-private partnerships (PPP) for collaboration in training;
- Capacity development for application of the upgraded Skills for Trade and Economic Diversification (STED) and skills anticipation methodologies.



Project beneficiary countries

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Global Project objectives

Project work in Viet Nam relates to Objective 2 and relevant outputs under Objective 3:

1. To increase capacity of governments and stakeholders to review, reform and implement national training policies, systems, and strategies in line with identified priorities;
2. To strengthen skills training systems in economic sectors through development of capacity for producing and applying occupational standards, qualifications, programs of competency-based training and assessment instruments;
3. To upgrade and apply the methodology of skills foresight and the TVET institution manager training program in five regions and selected sectors of the Russian Federation, and in selected countries-beneficiaries, by Moscow School of Management, Skolkovo (SKOLKOVO) with participation of Russian industry and TVET experts.

Expected Project outcomes (Viet Nam component)

- Industry bodies and Sector Skills Councils introduced or improved already existent systems of sectoral TVET governance;
- National bodies and sectoral stakeholders acquired knowledge, skills and participated in developing occupational standards, qualifications and skills assessment instruments;
- National bodies and TVET institutions acquired knowledge and skills for developing competency-based training programmes;
- National bodies, sectoral stakeholders and TVET providers acquired practical capabilities through piloting developed occupational standards, qualifications, training programmes and assessment instruments in the Tourism and Hospitality sector;
- TVET institutions and business cooperatives acquired capacity to establish public-private partnership in selected economic sectors of Viet Nam as a replicable model for collaboration in training;
- Key national constituents built capacity to successfully apply the upgraded Skills for Trade and Economic Diversification (STED) methodology;
- National managers of training institutions trained on the improved training programme for TVET institution managers.

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
