Youth Employment Context

- 61% of the youth (15-24) are unemployed
- 2 Million young women and men enter the labor market each year
- 70% of all Indonesians work in the informal economy
- Shortage of skilled workers and low productivity

- Encouraging labor intensive and Green initiatives in the informal economy
- Encouraging the growth of socially sustainable enterprises with the ability to create jobs which have a positive environmental impact



Characteristics

- Implemented by HIVOS
- 60 units built for these 2 districts
- 400 units planned for these 2 districts for 2010
- 3,000 Kg firewood saved/year/household
- 3 hours workload saved /day/household



Introducing a biogas initiative

- Creation of new employment opportunities in construction, after sale service, marketing, training, manufacturing, microfinance...
- 12,250 working days created for 2 districts
- Government policy introduced at province level

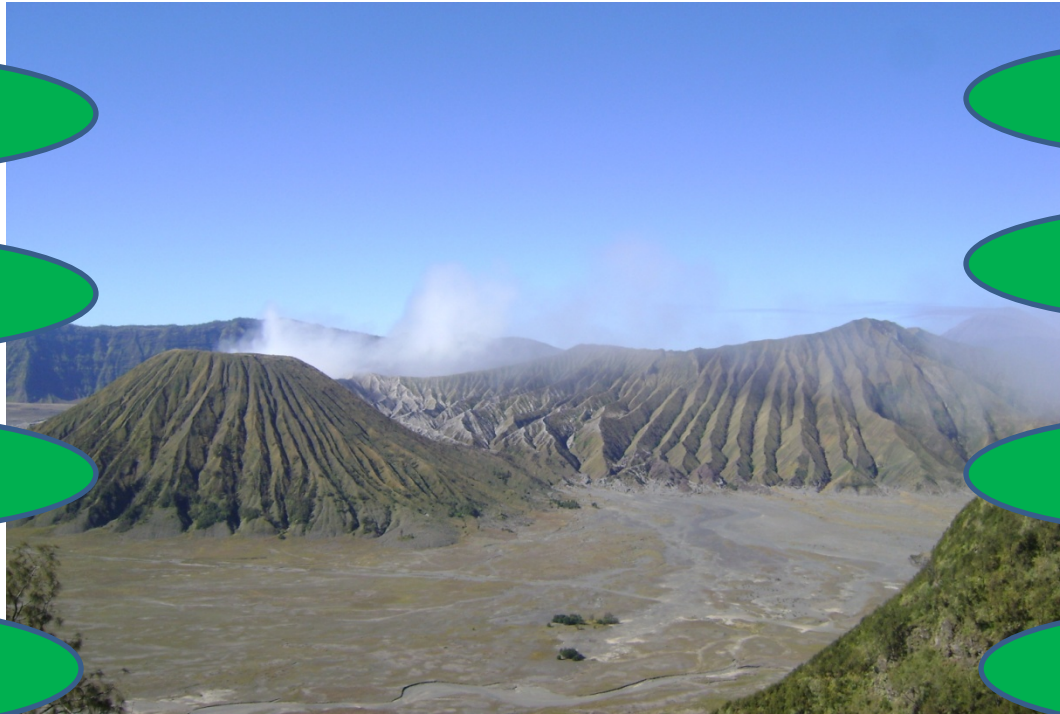
