Why is the workshop important

- Domestic workers are not protected against exploitation
 - Their rights are not respected
- We need to learn more to do more

- Discuss issues related to ensuring legal protection for domestic workers in Asia and
- Share innovative solutions that can be used in overcoming the challenges.

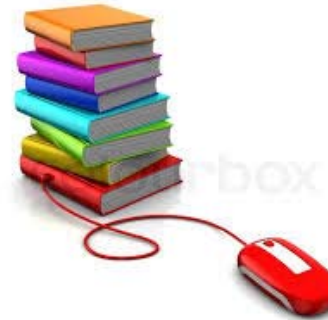
