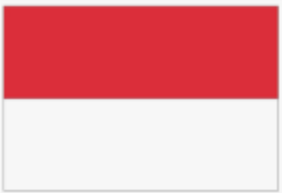

Regional progress

PSC and programme management

Ongoing

- Third meeting of the PSC in December 2021. Fourth PSC in May 2022.
- All seven countries now staffed and active – consultations done, workplans developed and implementation begun.
- First annual report to the EU submitted and accepted. **98% delivery rate** across the three agencies.

Communications and visibility plan

Done

- Newsletter (quarterly) developed and issued.
- Ship to Shore Rights SEA website viewed by over 1,800 visitors including country pages, news stories, publications, contract opportunities and resources.
- Kemlu livestream with ILO 'Trend, Pattern and Mechanism for Handling TIP cases in Indonesia' (April 2021) 26,436 views.

M&E plan and tools

Done

- Evaluability assessment done.
- M&E plan finalized. M&E tools and data collection system being finalized.
- **Baseline Survey (ILO, IOM and UNDP) will take place in Indonesia – in progress.**

Forthcoming

- **Re-launch of the Southeast Asian Forum for Fishers in Q3 of 2022: regional coordination meeting bringing together governments, workers, private sector – concept notes currently being developed.** Multiday event with side events. In collaboration with the Government of Indonesia.
- Preparatory events leading up to the regional coordination meeting, including sharing of best practices and knowledge within Southeast Asia and with destination countries: e.g. Seafood Good Labour Practices – Thailand/Indonesia exchanges of experience and scoping adaptation; Indonesia/Philippines and Thailand exchange of experience on labour inspections onboard fishing vessels.

Research & Strategies

Ongoing

- ILO regional research to map and assess licensing, reporting, monitoring and inspection practices for recruit agency regulation complete. Training to follow including in Indonesia.
- ILO study on **the impact of COVID-19 on working conditions in fishing and seafood processing in Southeast Asia** to be launched on 27 April 2022 with webinar.
- ILO study on **gender and women empowerment strategy** finalized and will be published in May 2022.
- ILO study on **risks and opportunities of observer programmes for the monitoring of labour conditions at sea** – developed and started. Drafts briefing notes by August 2022.
- ILO **synthesis study on the rules and regulations for migrant fishers in destination countries** currently being developed.

Challenges, Risks and Mitigation

- ▶ COVID 19 Impact on implementation: fewer opportunities to be 'in the field', delays in implementation, prioritize
- ▶ Increased risk of workers' rights violation during the pandemic : close monitoring of the situation and coordination with partners, monitoring policy changes particularly in relation to recruitment fees and related costs of migration.
