

Decent Work Country Programme

The Decent Work Country Programme (DWCP) Outcomes of ILO for the Philippines supports the country's Labour Employment Plan, 2011-2016 (LEP). The LEP embodies the priorities and commitments that the tripartite partners – government, workers and employers' organizations – agreed to pursue according to the four pillars of decent work. The ILO intends to support the updating of the LEP taking into account recent national and international developments, e.g., updated Philippines Development Plan and the adoption of the Sustainable Development Goals.

The DWCP Outcomes sets out two major priorities (1) Decent Jobs for a Competitive Philippines, and (2) Improved Labour Market Governance. To help realize these, the Office will help strengthen the institutional capacity of workers and employers' organizations as well as the overall capacity of the country to ratify and apply international labour Conventions.

The Decent Work framework is established as one of the priority outcomes UN Development Assistance Framework (UNDAF), serving as a vehicle to elevate the priorities of the tripartite partners in the UN System and the overall national development frameworks.
