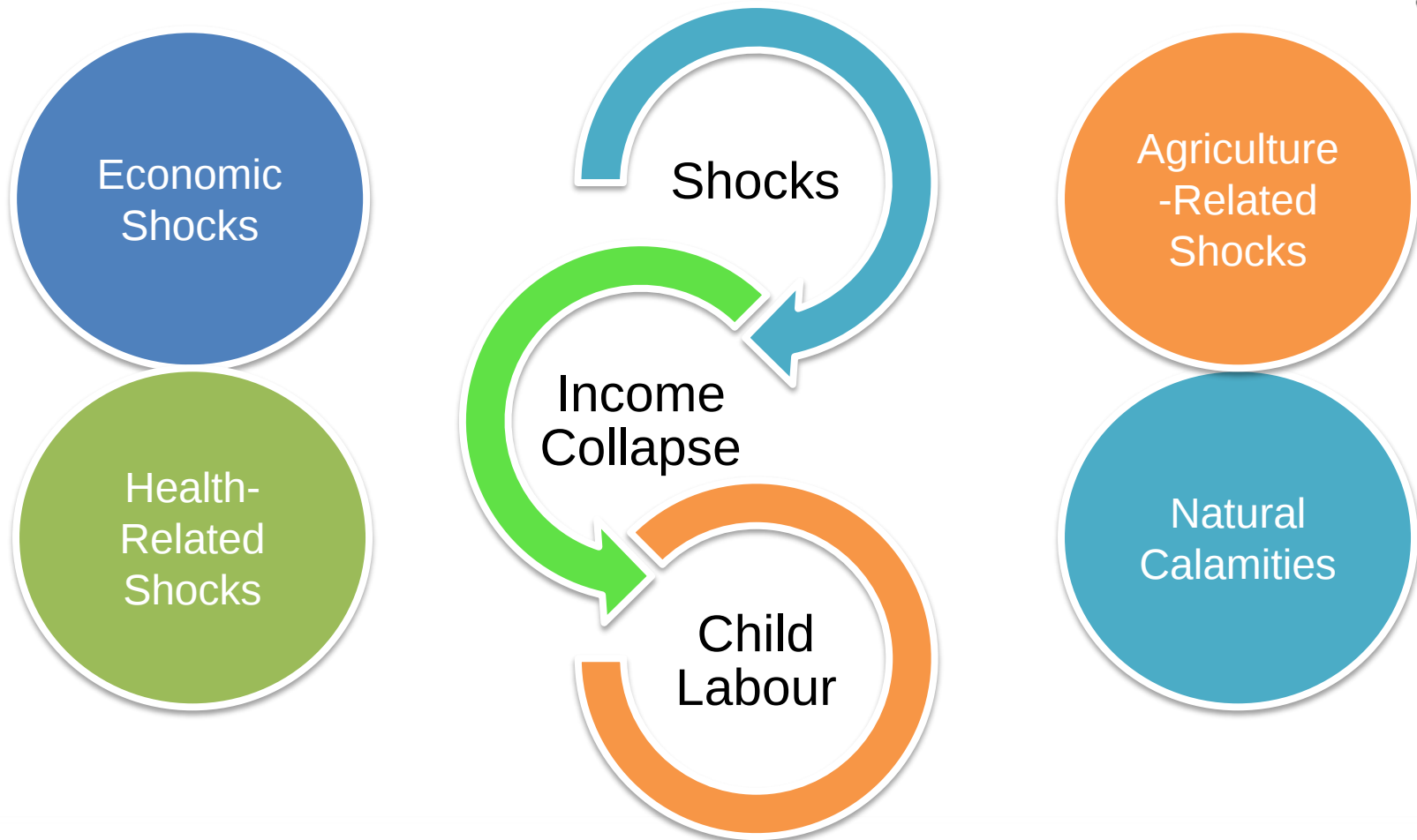

54% of barangays report children participating in harsh and dangerous labor

Type of work:

- 37% farm work
- 23% household helpers
- 17% transporting goods/people

39% of barangays report that children's involvement in harsh and dangerous labor has increased since Typhoon Yolanda

- 44% in **Region VIII**
- 46% in **rural** communities

27% of barangays report that new *types* of harsh and dangerous labor have emerged since Typhoon Yolanda

- 31% in **Region VIII**
- 40% in **displacement** communities

Gaps in 4Ps vs. Child Labour?

- Educational subsidy is really not enough to cover all educational needs
- Support is only for three children
- Children may still be in hazardous work after school hours – how about mandatory after-schooling to provide alternative to child labour outside formal schooling hours
- Minimal child labour content in Family Development Sessions
- Supply-side issues, as for instance health facilities and schools might not be accessible.

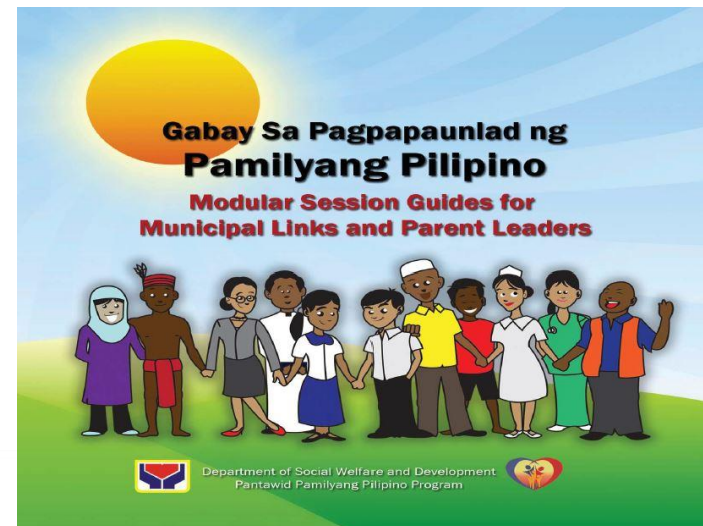
