	Results and Outcomes • 25,995 children withdrawn from work in selected hazardous sectors, including child domestic work, construction, match industry, leather tanning industry, and <i>bidi</i> (hand-rolled cigarettes) rolling. • 5,463 children prevented from work in selected hazardous sectors. • Mobilized a broad alliance of governmental and non-governmental agencies, communities, employers, trade unions, parents and children in taking joint action against hazardous child labour in the selected sectors through multipronged interventions. • Provided livelihood alternatives to withdrawn children and their families. • Monitored child labour both in the workplace and in the target communities. • Built the capacity of the government, social partners, families and communities on child labour.
