Strengthen public policies aimed at child labour, with special attention to agriculture and domestic child labour.

Broaden income transfer programmes to eradicate poverty.

Establish governmental commitments towards integral education, professional training, culture, sports and leisure.

Appeal to the all countries to ratify the ILO Worst Forms of Child Labour Convention, 1999 (No. 182) by the next Conference in 2017

Integrate education, healthcare and social assistance policies to identify child labour and other violations of rights.

Ensure the participation of children and adolescents in the policy decision-making processes.



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**The Brasilia Declaration
on Child Labour**

Brasilia Declaration on Child Labour



Acknowledges progress made so far.

Renews the commitment towards the goal for 2016.

Notes that the violation of rights cannot be used as a trade advantage.

Reinforces the need to accelerate the pace of elimination.

Acknowledges the role of governments, decent work policies and cooperation.

Brings attention to the concept of sustained eradication of child labour.

Emphasizes the need for appropriate legal and institutional frameworks.

Highlights the importance of accurate and disaggregated statistics.

Points the way to the next conference to be held in Argentina, 2017.

Propelling group of twelve countries : Argentina, Brazil, Colombia, Costa Rica, Ecuador, Mexico, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Peru, Dominican Republic and Uruguay.

The propelling group of countries acknowledges ILO role in promoting cooperation between the countries and requests the organization to take on the initiative's technical secretariat.

Thirteen more countries join the Initiative:
Bahamas, Bolivia, Chile, Cuba, El Salvador, Guatemala, Guyana, Haiti, Honduras, Jamaica, Suriname, Trinidad and Tobago, and Venezuela.
