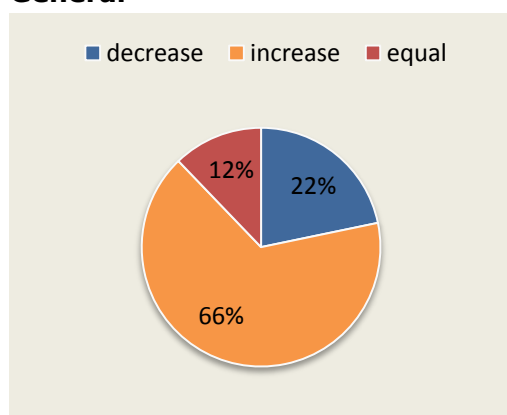


ICEM – IMF Survey on Contract and Agency Labour / Precarious work

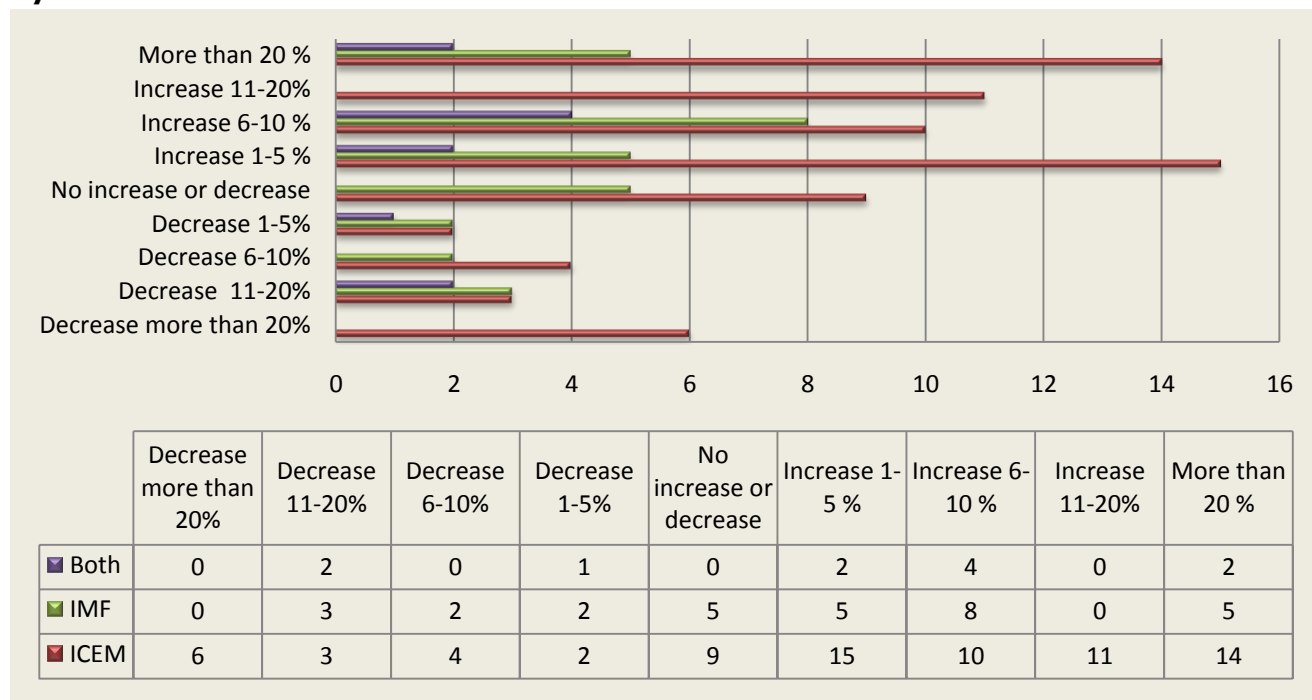
The results of this survey are based on a questionnaire sent to all IMF and ICEM affiliates in October/November 2009¹

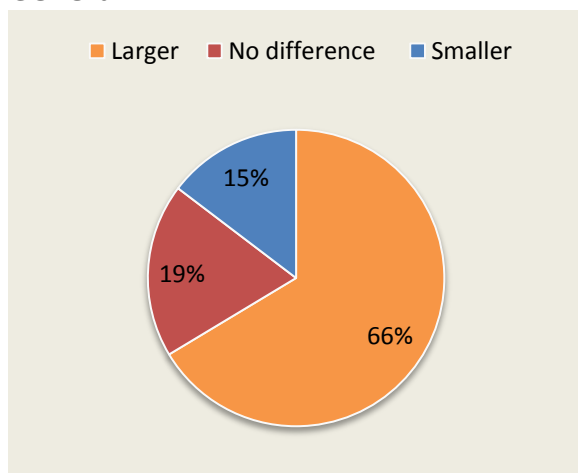

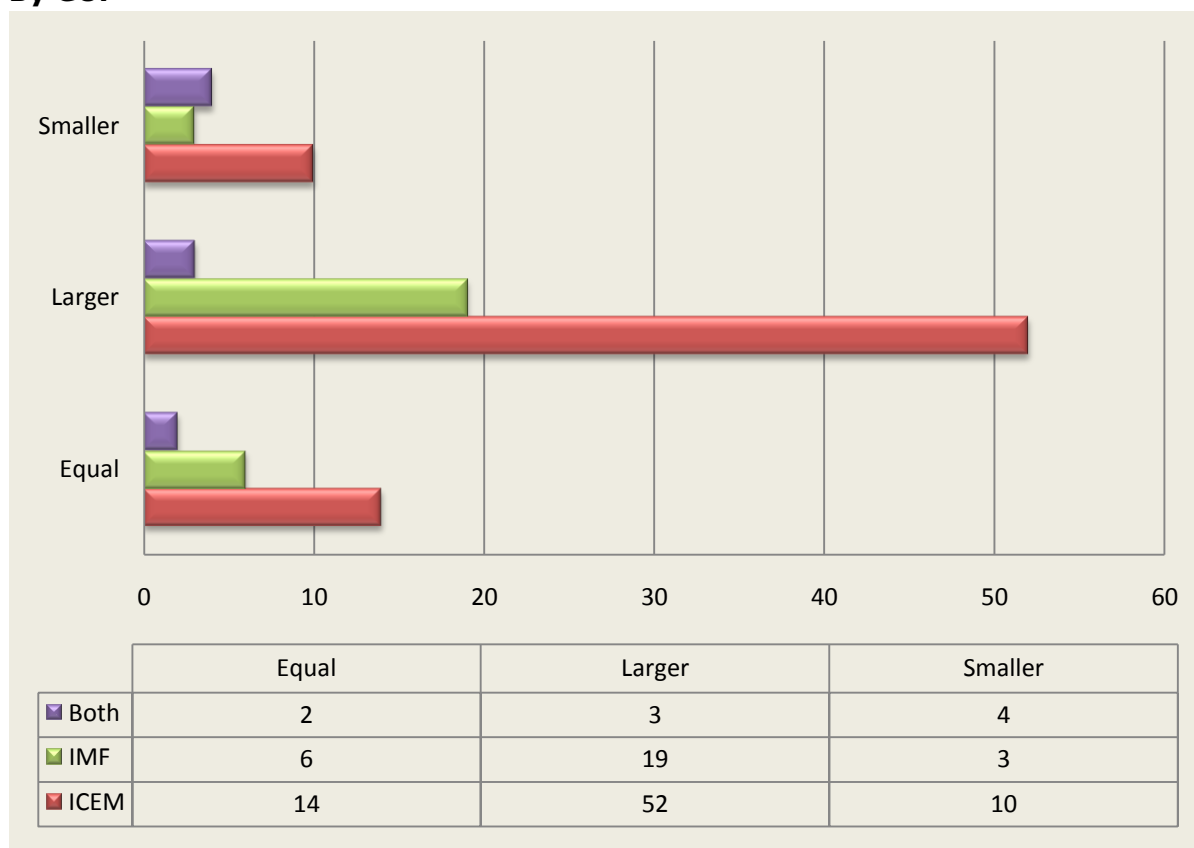

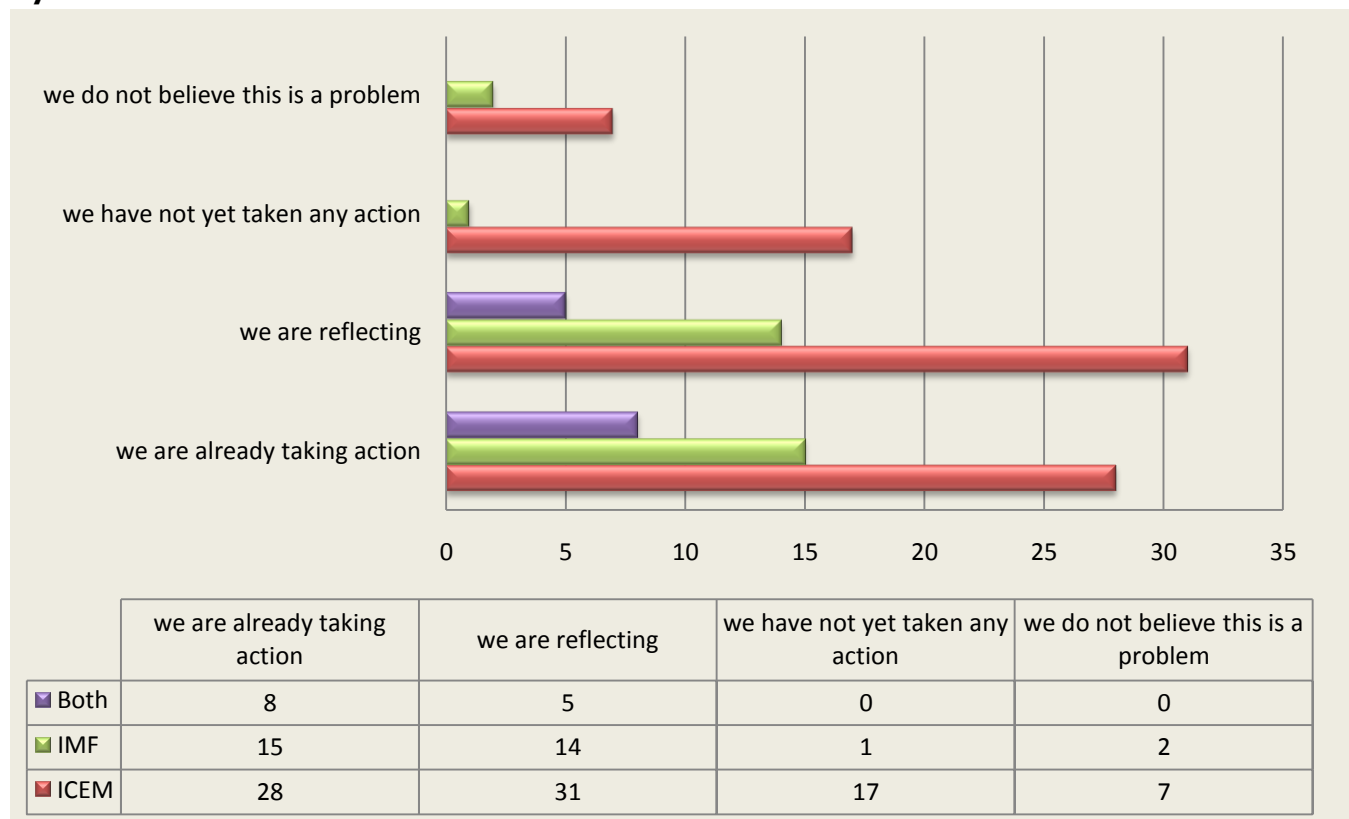

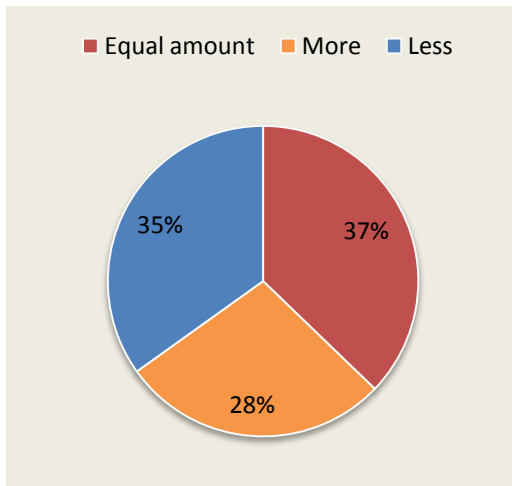

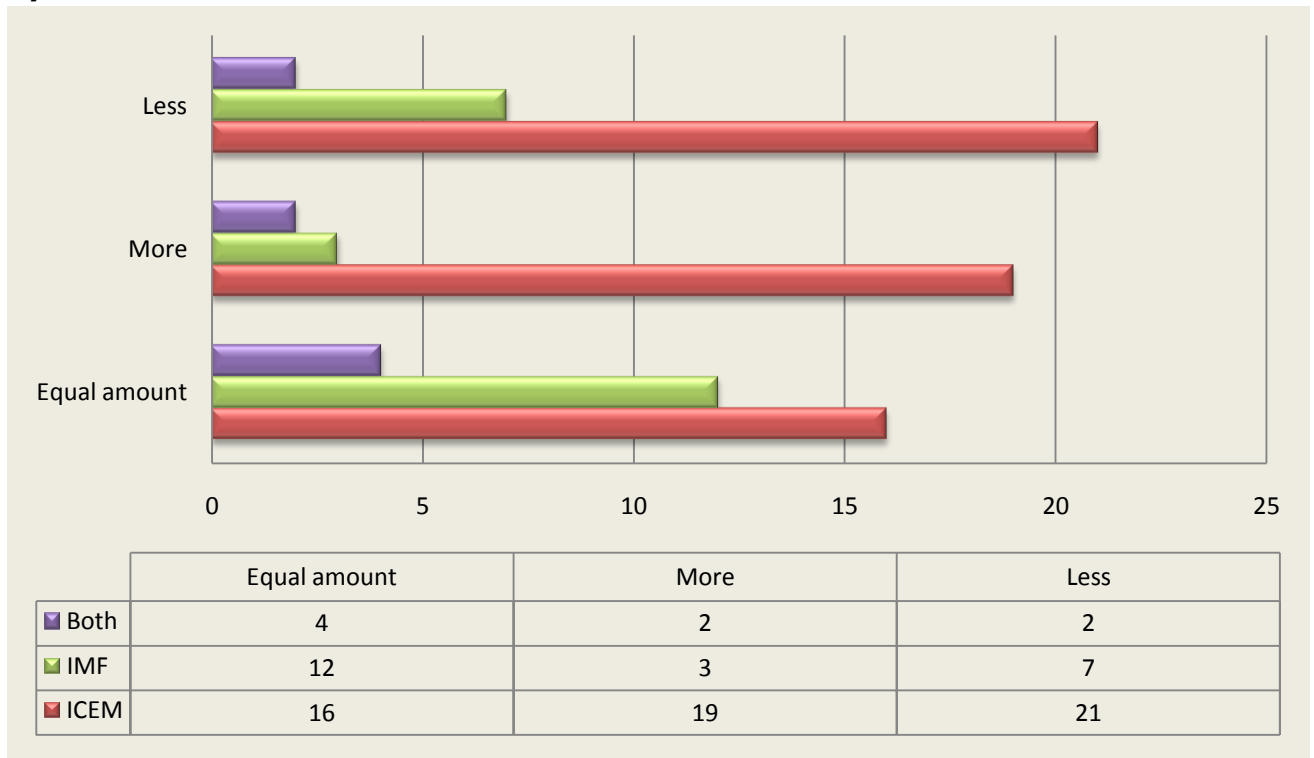

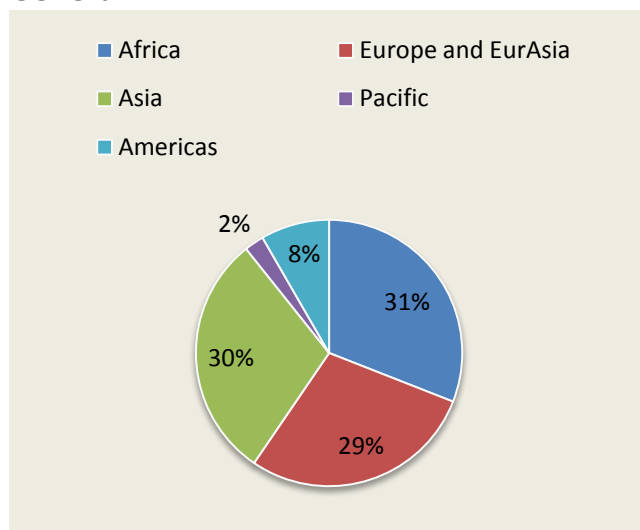

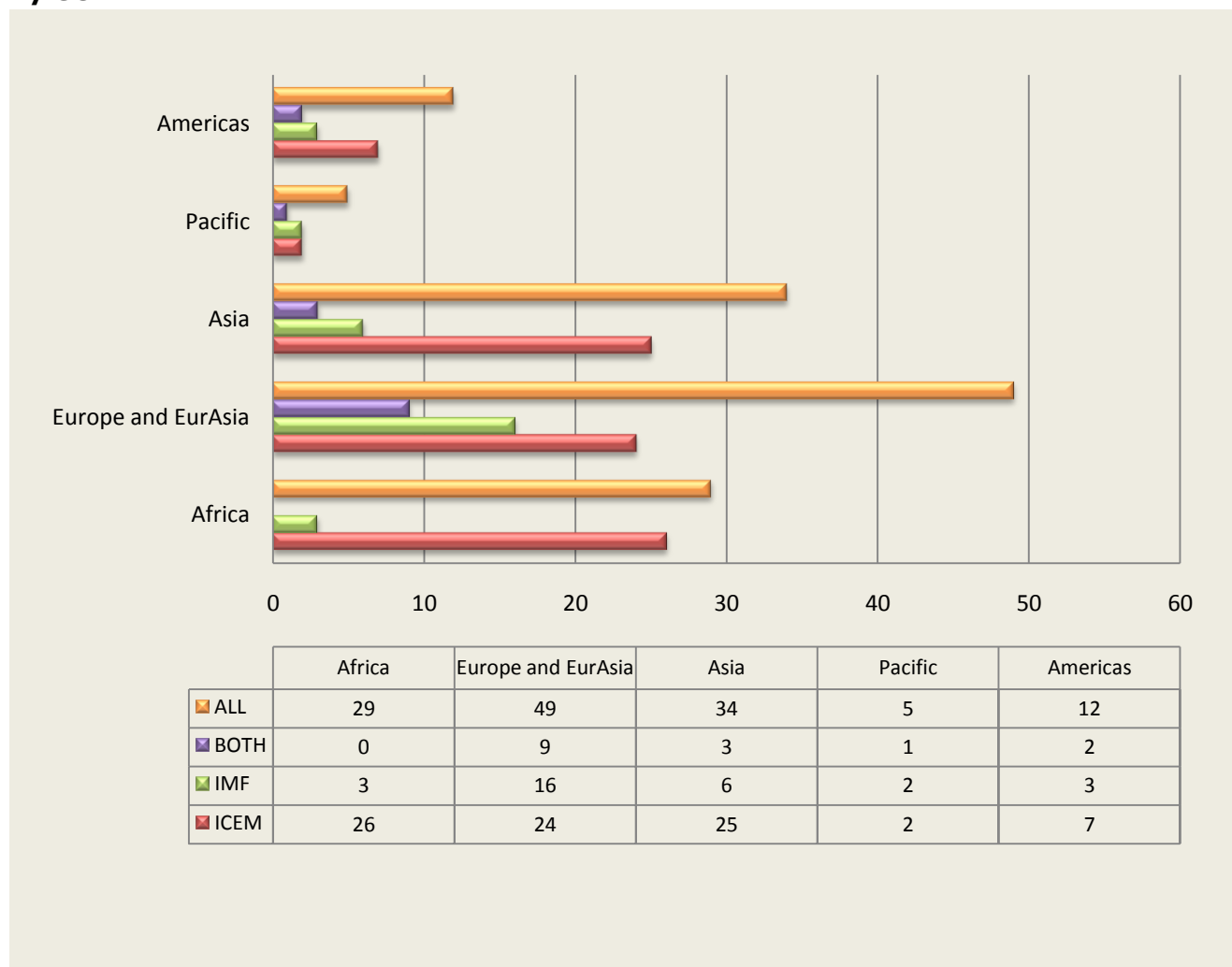
