Knowledge Management Platforms

- Agencies and emphasis on Knowledge Management
- Post-2015, Climate change adaptation, Crisis Response, MDG-F, UN PCEIR, Migration, Innovation, Environment GEF
- UN Teamworks
- MDG-F, youth employment KMP that was inter-agency.

Main elements of the Knowledge Management Platforms

- Platforms for connecting practitioners and exchanging information (across UN and wider stakeholders)
- Promoting regional, inter-regional and global knowledge and mutual learning workshops
- Social networking and feedback
- South-South collaboration at regional level (YEKS in West Africa and MENA; Doha events)
- Development of methodologies for joint programming on YE (YEM)
- Tools for YE diagnostics, analysis, networking and evaluation
- Identification, analysis and dissemination of innovative/good practices

Lessons Learned

- Use the past experience of KM Platforms on YE to shape the KM element of this initiative;
- Many of the past KNP were project based, discontinued after project closure;
- Link KM products, tools, guidance to continuous capacity building of practitioners;
- Evaluations of YE projects and KM/ programme design and implementation
