BMZ Draft Education Strategy

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Goals in TVET

- Promotion of TVET systems which are work process oriented and match with the labour market demand
- Financing construction and equipment of TVET schools and Centres for Advanced Technology Training and Services
 - TVET is regarded as one stage in the life-long learning process.
 - German DC in TVET combines vocational training with proactive labour market policy tools.
 - Career guidance, careers advice and placement services help to make the transition between training and work as smooth as possible.

Guiding principles

1. Close cooperation of public and private sector
2. Work process orientation
3. National standards and qualification frameworks
4. Qualifying teachers, trainers and other staff
5. Continuous TVET research

Ten Objectives for Education - BMZ Draft Education Strategy 2010-2013

- Education is a strategic key to development. The challenge of providing quality education **for all** is more urgent than ever before.
- BMZ will therefore be making education a strategic factor in German development cooperation.
- First BMZ strategy to cover entire education sector – including TVET, formal, non-formal and informal education.
- Consultations of draft strategy until September 2011

Ten Objectives for Education (1)

1. Overcome educational deprivation
2. Promote education on a holistic basis
3. Improve the quality of and access to basic education

Ten Objectives for Education (2)

4. Expand vocational education and training

- Initiate new vocational training partnerships that bring together the private and the public sectors
- Break new ground by making private-sector expertise and private-sector capital deliver for development
- Intend to raise awareness in our partner countries of the importance of vocational training and upgrading
- Increasingly work with the local private sector to train local specialists, especially in industries set to become more important in the future

Ten Objectives for Education (3)

5. Strengthen higher education and research
6. Integrate innovative approaches in education
7. Involve all important actors

Ten Objectives for Education (4)

8. Cooperate closely with the private sector
9. Measure education efforts more effectively
10. Enhance visibility and public support to education
