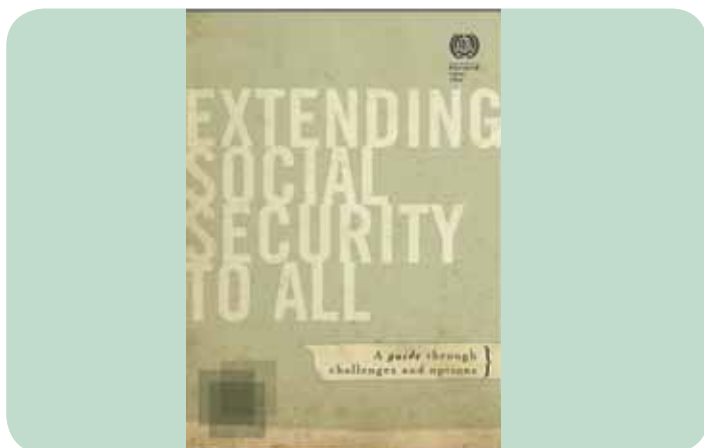

What is Extending social security to all?

It is a guide, published in 2010, outlining basic concepts such as the social protection floor and the social security staircase; analyzing the affordability of various approaches; and examining the results of practices around the world, especially in low- and middle-income countries

For whom?

- **Direct beneficiaries:** Policy makers, ILO constituents, international agencies including the UN
- **Ultimate beneficiaries:** Global population

For what purpose?

Provide information and guidance to policy makers and ILO constituents on policies to extend social security coverage (including the social protection floor)

How is it delivered?

- Handing out of the guide for self-help use



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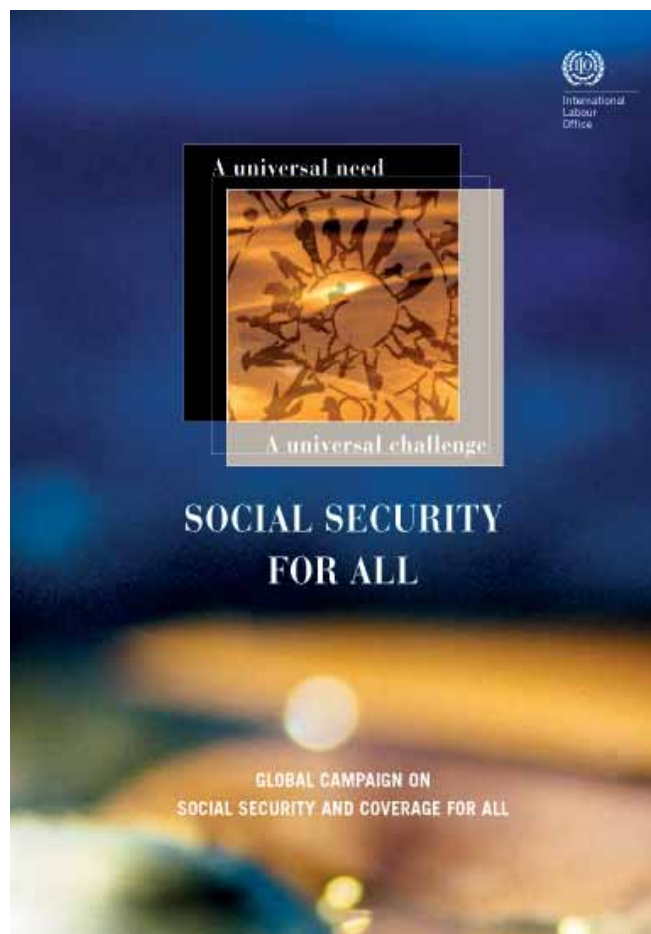
What are its components?

- Social security
- Income security
- Access to health care
- Risks management
