Trafficking and other Worst Forms of Child Labour in Central and Eastern Europe (Phase II)	30 September 2006	31 July 2010	United States
Objective: This project will contribute to the reduction and elimination of trafficking and other worst forms of child labour (WFCL) in Albania, Bulgaria, Kosovo (as defined by the UN Security Council Resolution no. 1244), Moldova, Romania and Ukraine. At the end of the project: (1) country wide upscaling of IPEC models of prevention / identification / referral and rehabilitation / tracking, through capacity building of institutions and greater involvement of employers will have increased the outreach of institutions to eliminate worst forms of child labour, (2) 4,500 children will have been either prevented or withdrawn from the Worst Forms of Child Labour in sectors/areas previously not addressed by IPEC interventions and (3) mainstreaming of WFCL into national policies and legislation, and awareness raising / mobilisation activities will have supported an			

increase of resources allocated to the elimination of the worst forms of child labour.
