Approval of the Second Additional Protocol to the Convention on Migration between Argentina and the Republic of Bolivia, signed in Buenos Aires on December 12, 2003.

Law:

SECTION 1 - To approve the SECOND ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL TO THE CONVENTION OF MIGRATION BETWEEN ARGENTINA REPUBLIC AND THE REPUBLIC OF BOLIVIA, signed in Buenos Aires on December 12, 2003, consisting of three (3) items, as certified photocopy part of this law.

SECTION 2 - Communicate to the Executive Branch.

SECOND ADDITIONAL PROTOCOL

MIGRATION TO AGREEMENT

BETWEEN THE REPUBLIC OF ARGENTINA

AND THE REPUBLIC OF BOLIVIA

Argentina and the Republic of Bolivia, hereinafter "the Parties",

Taking into consideration the provisions of the Migration Agreement between Argentina and the Republic of Bolivia from February 16, 1998, as amended by the Additional Protocol to the Convention on Migration between Argentina and the Republic of Bolivia from November 6, 2000 ,

Given that the 365-day period provided for in Article 2 paragraph b) Migration Convention 1998, as amended by the Additional Protocol of 2000 to nationals of a Party effects found in an irregular situation in the territory of the other, submit your request to the appropriate regularization immigration authority ends on 1 August 2003 and that the will of both parties to extend the deadline by another month period,

Have agreed as follows

ARTICLE I

Amend section 2, clause b) of the Migration 1998, to read as follows:

"This Convention as amended by Additional Protocol II applies to:

b) Nationals of a Party, that being in an irregular situation in the territory of the other and pretending to regularize the same to develop formal activities as employees or independent, submitted within 365 days from 2 August 2003 before the corresponding migration services, its application for regularization and documentation as determined in Article 4, subsection a) amended by the

Additional Protocol signed on November 6, 2000 "Convention.

SECTION 2

Amend section 4 in fine of the Convention on Migration 1998, as amended by Article 2 of the Additional Protocol to the Convention on Migration between Argentina and the Republic of Bolivia, to read as follows:

"When the application is made before the migration services, these documents should only be accredited by the consular agent of the country of origin accredited to the receiving country, no other collection petitioner.

"For the purposes of registration, identification and issue of identifying the level of Argentina suffice legalizing birth certificate issued by the chief consular authority of the Party accredited to the other Party whose signature it is registered with the authority immigration and identification. "

SECTION 3

This Additional Protocol shall be an integral part of the Convention on Migration, will provisionally applied from the date of signature and shall enter into force on the date of the last notification by which the Parties' compliance with their internal requirements for entry to communicate in force.
