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Zimbabwe – Lesotho – South Africa tri-national workers declaration promoting labour and human rights of MDWs

A joint declaration was signed by trade unions and domestic workers' organizations at the tri-national workshop in Johannesburg, South Africa, 10-11 October 2014, committing to support and strengthen capacity of domestic workers' organizations and lobby the three governments to continue implementation of their decent work country programmes incorporating rights of migrant workers. The workshop was organized by the EU funded Global Action Programme on Migrant Domestic Workers and their Families (GAP-MDW).

Representatives of the Congress of South African Trade Unions (COSATU), Zimbabwe Domestic and Allied Workers Union (ZDAWU), South African Domestic Services and Allied Workers Union (SADSAWU), Federation of Unions of South Africa (FEDUSA), Lesotho Trade Union Congress (LTCU), Zimbabwe Congress of Trade Unions (ZCTU) committed to support the strategies promoting human and labour rights of migrant domestic workers along the South Africa, Lesotho and Zimbabwe corridor and to implement the action plans developed during the meeting. Additionally, communication strategy was agreed upon in order to create a platform for trade unions and domestic workers' organizations from different countries to exchange information and good practices.
