

2012 Jordan Population and Family Health Survey (JPFHS)

The 2012 Jordan Population and Family Health Survey (JPFHS) provides data for monitoring the population and health situation in Jordan. The 2012 JPFHS is the sixth Demographic and Health Survey to be conducted in the country. Repeated surveys allow for an analysis of trends over time.

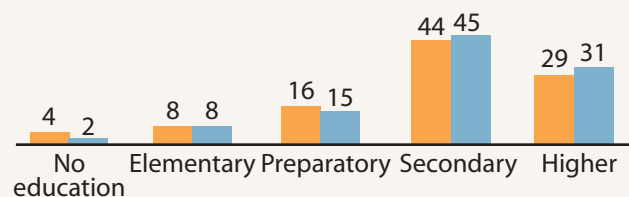
The survey is based on a nationally representative sample. It provides estimates at the national (urban and rural), for the governorates, and for two special domains: the Badia areas and people living in refugee camps.

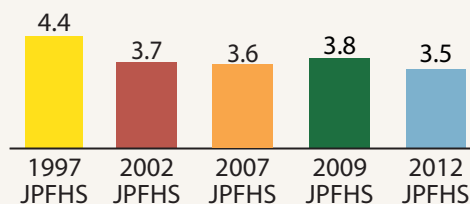
Percent of ever-married women age 15-49, by highest level of education

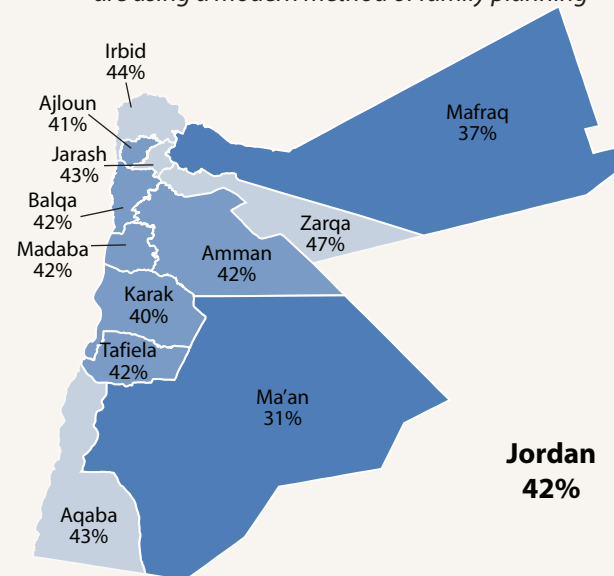
Trends in Fertility

Use of Modern Methods by Governorate

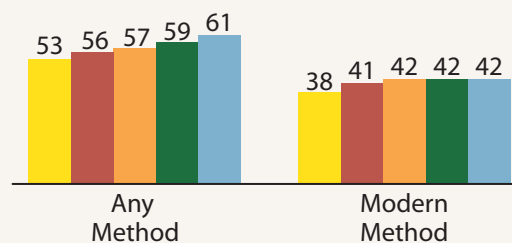
Percent of currently married women age 15-49 who are using a modern method of family planning

Percent of currently married women age 15-49 who are currently using contraception

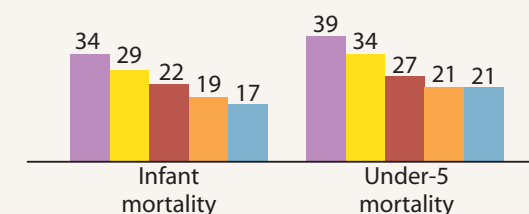

Trends in Childhood Mortality

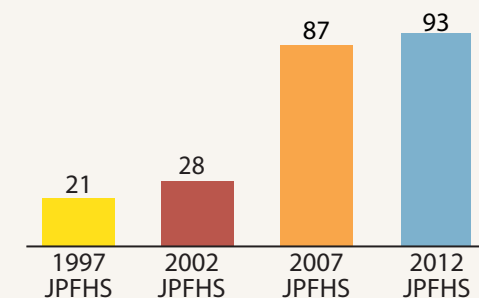
Deaths per 1,000 live births

Trends in Vaccination Coverage

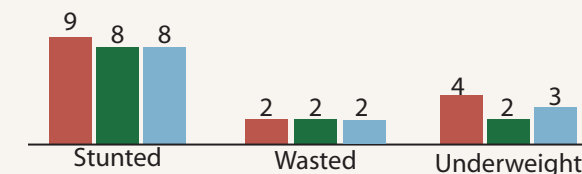
Percent of children age 12-23 months who have received all basic vaccinations (BCG, measles, and 3 doses each of DPT and polio)

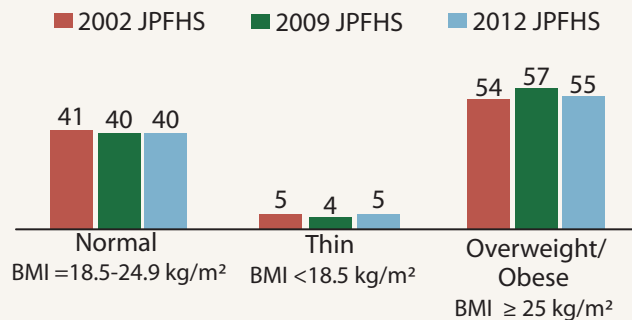

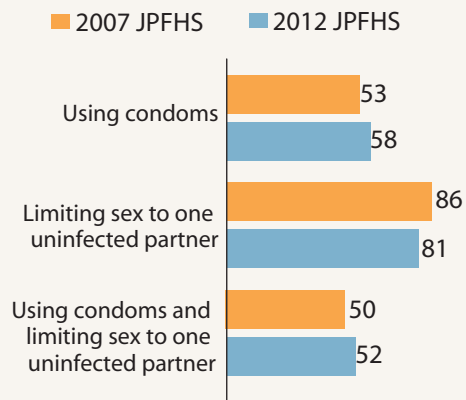
Trends in Women's Nutritional Status

Body Mass Index (BMI)



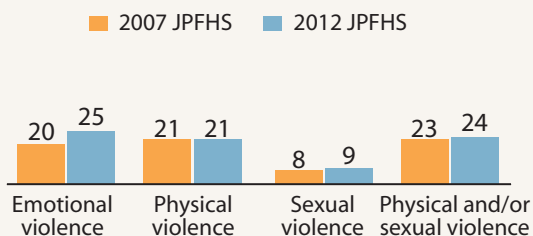
Trends in Knowledge of HIV Prevention
