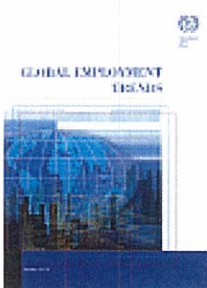
International labour migration: a rights-based approach

It reflects on existing and potential international governance structures and addresses linkages between migration and development.

Regional experiences are also presented including a snapshot of the impact of the crisis on the labour markets in selected economies.

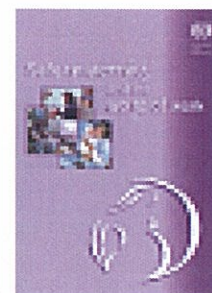

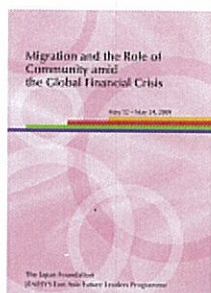
Safe maternity and the world of work

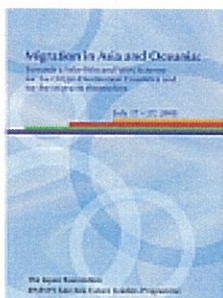
Migration and the role of community amid the global financial crisis

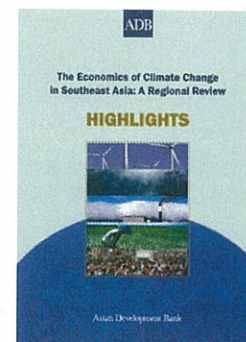
CLIMATE CHANGE
