Best practices in fostering migration opportunities: do they work? (Working paper No. 22)






Managing labour migration: the case of the Filipino and Indonesia domestic helper market in Hongkong (Working paper No. 23)

Prospect for future outward migration: China and Southeast Asia (Working paper No. 24)

It finds that while current migration streams are likely to continue in the short run, important developments in demographic, economic, political and environmental factors – which vary for the different countries – are likely to shape longer term future migration from the region.






Occupational wages and hours of work and retail food prices, 2009 (print and CD versions)
