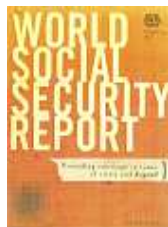

Winning the numbers, losing the war: the other MDG report, 2010



The report is on the Philippines progress on the *Millennium Development Goals* (MDGs)

and the prospects of achieving them by 2015. In five years time (2010-2015), MDGs will be due. These are the eight development goals which the international community of nations has committed to attain within 15 years.

In 2015, all the 191 country signatories to the MDGs will meet at the United Nations and report on the success or failure of the MDGs. Even now, the sense of urgency is palpable. Countries are busy assessing each of the eight goals to determine which are likely to be attained and those which are at risk. They are working out strategies to speed up the attainment of goals which have lesser chances of being reached.
